The City of Berkeley is soliciting written proposals from qualified firms or individuals to provide *Trauma Support Services for Latinx*. As a Request for Proposal (RFP) this is <u>not</u> an invitation to bid and although price is very important, other factors will be taken into consideration.

The project scope, content of proposal, and vendor selection process are summarized in the RFP (attached). **Proposals must be received no later than 2:00 pm, on April 28, 2021.** Proposals are to be sent via email with the title "Trauma Support Services for the Latinx/Latino Population" and Specification No. <u>21-11433-C</u> clearly indicated in the subject line of the email. Please submit one (1) PDF of the technical proposal. Corresponding pricing proposal shall be submitted via email as a separate document.

The City retains the right to award all or parts of this contract to several bidders, to not select any bidders, and/or to re-solicit proposals. The act of submitting a proposal is a declaration that the proposer has read the RFP and understands all the requirements and conditions.

I. BACKGROUND /SUMMARY/or INTRODUCTION

The City of Berkeley (the "City"), Health, Housing and Community Services (HHCS) Department, Mental Health Division is seeking a local contractor with expertise in providing trauma support services for the Latinx/Latino population (aged 16 & above) in Berkeley. The total amount of the contract is \$100,000 for one (1) year, or a twelve-month timeframe. Following the initial term, this contract may be extended on an annual basis subject to funding availability and contractor performance.

In November 2004, California voters passed Proposition 63, the Mental Health Services Act (MHSA). Through five (5) funding components, the MHSA is to be utilized to expand and transform the mental health service delivery system to become more integrated, culturally competent, consumer and family member driven, and wellness and recovery oriented. MHSA funding has provided new opportunities for the Berkeley Mental Health Division (BMH) to further develop and expand its system of care, adding new programs and utilizing non-profit providers in the planning and delivery of comprehensive mental health services. MHSA funds are allocated to mental health jurisdictions on an annual basis. In order to utilize MHSA funds, stakeholder informed Three (3) Year Plans and Annual Updates that outline how funds will be utilized are required to be developed and locally approved.

One of the five (5) funding components of MHSA is Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI). The purpose of PEI programs are for strategies to recognize early signs of mental illness and to improve early access to services and programs, including the reduction of stigma and discrimination and for strategies to prevent mental illness from becoming severe and disabling. Since the initial MHSA PEI Plan, BMH has utilized funding to implement the "Community Education and Supports" program. This program provides culturally-responsive, psycho-educational trauma support services for individuals (16 and above) in various cultural, ethnic and age specific populations that are unserved, underserved and inappropriately served in Berkeley including: African Americans; Latinx/Latinos; Transition Age Youth (TAY); Older Adults; and Lesbian, Gay, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual, Plus others (LGBTQIA+).

Per the current MHSA Three (3) Year Plan the Community Education and Supports program has implemented services to each targeted population through various community partners over a period of time. In order to ensure fair City Contracting practices, BMH is undergoing an RFP process for this program, releasing separate RFP's for each targeted population.

Latinx/Latino youth, adults and older adults are one of the populations served through this program. Input received during MHSA community program planning processes, as well as from other local gatherings and City meeting venues, has repeatedly resounded the need for health and racial equity for the Latinx community. Additionally, community input for the initial PEI Plan, subsequent MHSA Plans, and for this RFP indicated that some of the areas Latinx experience trauma include the following: Lack of access to service providers that are bilingual and culturally and linguistically competent; discrimination and unfair labeling over language proficiency; social oppression; stresses around multi-generations of families caught between two countries and two (2) cultures – the country of origin and America; experience of culture shock and stress related to immigration and integrating into a new culture; lack of services and supports for everyday stresses and problems; domestic violence; sexual assault; depression; substance abuse; stigma and fear around accessing mental health services; racism and discrimination; coming from a war-torn country etc. Identified health disparities that have long been prevalent due to social, economic, environmental factors, etc., as well as the deleterious effects of racism, have also been mirrored on the local, State and National levels during the pandemic, as data has shown that Latinx/Latinos are among one of the vulnerable populations who have been hit hard by Covid-19.

II. SCOPE OF SERVICES

Service Description

BMH is seeking a community partner with expertise in providing culturally, ethnically and linguistically responsive trauma support services for Latinx/Latino youth, adults and older adults in Berkeley. The community partner will demonstrate the use of trauma-informed, strength-based approaches and other community-defined methods that will promote resiliency factors. Services should include culturally, ethnically and linguistically responsive outreach and

engagement, individual and group support services, family and community member supports, linkages and referrals. There will also be flexibility to add on additional services, as the chosen community partner will be the most knowledgeable of the types of trauma support services that best meet the needs of the targeted population. The project should be structured to serve approximately 250 individuals.

Many Latinx/Latinos have a mistrust of the health care system and/or feel stigmatized around the use of mental health services, the community partner will demonstrate the use of outreach and engagement methods that reduce stigma and barriers to accessing services. Outreach and support services should include sensitivity to, and inclusion of, an individual's socio-cultural background, spiritual beliefs and/or practices, sexual orientation, gender, and gender presentation. Services should promote racial equity and should be: welcoming and inclusive of diverse populations; located in an area that is accessible to the target population; culturally, ethnically and linguistically responsive; and tailored to an individual's or group's needs. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and local and statewide shelter in place orders (that may continue to be in effect in some form throughout this year), the community partner should also demonstrate the capacity to utilize other alternative methods (including the use of technology platforms, such as Zoom, etc.) that will enable individuals to receive outreach and trauma support services. The agency selected for this RFP should provide technological support to this population, in order to deliver services online, as needed.

The community partner will have a multi-cultural, multi-lingual diverse staff with lived experience and the expertise in providing mental health services and supports for the Latinx/Latino population, and various sub-groups within the community. As community collaborations are important in serving this population, the community partner will have established relationships with area agencies serving diverse cultural and ethnic populations, Latinx/Latino community support systems, and religious and spiritual organizations. Supportive services should be trauma informed, strength-based, and include community-defined practices and approaches, as appropriate.

Individual and group services should provide support around a broad range of stressors including but not limited to: Discrimination and oppression; violence and bullying; stigma; sexual assault; grief/loss; social and economic oppression; acculturation issues; parenting; illness; financial loss; Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) etc. Services should also be tailored to incorporate family and community supports, and draw upon the spiritual beliefs of the program participants.

The ideal community partner will have the following qualifications:

- Demonstrated expertise providing trauma support services and supports to the targeted population.
- A diverse workforce with lived experience and expertise in providing mental health services and supports for Latinx/Latinos and various sub-groups within the population.
- A workforce that has been trained in trauma informed care and in providing services to the targeted population and sub-groups within the population.
- Demonstrated capabilities designing and implementing strengths-based, trauma informed mental health individual and group services and supports for the Latinx/Latino population.
- Expertise implementing culturally, ethically and linguistically responsive outreach, engagement and supportive services to the targeted population.
- Experience designing and implementing programs that de-stigmatize mental health services and supports.
- Established collaborative relationships and the demonstrated capability to refer individuals who may need more intensive mental health services and/or other supports.

Documentation and Reporting Requirements

The Community Partner will be expected to maintain documents on the following:

- PEI Demographic information on those served
- Log of outreach and number of individuals contacted
- Log of individual and support group activities, numbers attended
- Log of referrals to more intensive mental health services
- Number of individuals referred to other services, types of referrals/linkage
- Data on timeliness of access for any individual referred to additional mental health services
- Process and outcome data

- Itemized expenditure per approved budget
- Program successes and challenges

The Community Partner will also be expected to participate in the "Impact Berkeley" initiative. Impact Berkeley is an initiative that the Health, Housing and Community Services (HHCS) Department is currently implementing, which provides Results Based Accountability (RBA) into contract processes. All new or renewed contracts will be required to provide information and data that address the three basic RBA questions: How much work was done? How well was it done? And, are clients better off as a result of the services provided? HHCS will work with the Community Partner to identify appropriate targets for each performance measure. The Community Partner will be expected to report on how they measure whether clients are better off; the quality of the services that were delivered; comply with all processes that are developed to monitor and improve performance over time.

Contract Terms

It is anticipated that this contract will begin on July 1, 2021 and will be in effect until June 30, 2022. Following initial terms, this contract may be renewed on an annual basis subject to funding availability and contractor performance.

III. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All proposals shall include the following information, **organized as separate sections of the proposal**. The proposal should be concise and to the point.

1. Contractor Identification:

Provide the name of the firm, the firm's principal place of business, the name and telephone number of the contact person and company tax identification number. Provide an overview of the organization/agency including the target population, types of services provided, business structure, and length of time in this field of work.

Describe workforce diversity and expertise with implementing strength-based, trauma informed and culturally responsive mental health services for the targeted population, including training staff have received in Trauma Informed Care. If staff have not been trained in Trauma Informed Care, describe the plan for staff training. Describe how the organization/agency will promote racial equity and will provide welcoming and inclusive services that are in an accessible location to the target population, including measures that will be implemented to reach individuals during the pandemic. Provide a description of staff diversity, lived experiences and expertise providing services to the targeted population and sub-groups within the population. Describe collaborative relationships with area cultural and ethnic community-based agencies, Latinx/Latino community support systems, and religious and spiritual organizations.

2. Client References:

Provide three (3) professional references that include mental health services that were provided for the targeted population. For each reference, provide the designated person's name, title, organization, address, telephone number, and the project (s) that were completed under their direction. All references must be verifiable.

3. Program Description:

Provide a detailed description of the proposed program including the following aspects:

- How culturally, ethnically and linguistically responsive, trauma informed, strength-based individual and group services, and community-defined approaches will be designed and implemented to the targeted population and sub-groups
- Strategies to be utilized for outreach and engagement
- Methods to be utilized for identifying and referring individuals in need of additional mental health services and/or other community resources
- Proposed staffing, including staff diversity, expertise and lived experience
- Projected numbers to be served

4. <u>Cultural, Ethnic and Linguistic Responsiveness:</u>

Describe experience and expertise and proposed methodology in providing culturally, ethnically and linguistically responsive services to the targeted population. Demonstrate how the services will be designed to incorporate the socio-cultural context of the individual's needs. Include a detailed description of the proposed use of culturally, ethnically and linguistically responsive population specific strategies, tools, approaches, and resources.

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5. Price Proposal:

The proposal shall include pricing for all services. Pricing shall be all inclusive unless indicated otherwise. Pricing proposals shall be a separate document. The Proposal shall itemize all services, including hourly rates for all professional, technical and support personnel, and all other charges related to completion of the work shall be itemized.

6. Contract Terminations:

If your organization has had a contract terminated in the last five (5) years, describe such incident. Termination for default is defined as notice to stop performance due to the vendor's non-performance or poor performance and the issue of performance was either (a) not litigated due to inaction on the part of the vendor, or (b) litigated and such litigation determined that the vendor was in default.

Submit full details of the terms for default including the other party's name, address, and phone number. Present the vendor's position on the matter. The City will evaluate the facts and may, at its sole discretion, reject the proposal on the grounds of the past experience.

If the firm has not experienced any such termination for default or early termination in the past five (5) years, so indicate.

IV. SELECTION CRITERIA

The following criteria will be considered, although not exclusively, in determining which firm is hired.

- 1. Contractor Identification/Expertise (20%)
- 2. References -(10%)
- 3. Service Description and Plan (30%)
- 4. Cultural, Ethnic and Linguistic Responsiveness (30%)
- 5. Price Proposal/Budget (10%)

A selection panel of City Staff and Committee Stakeholders will be convened for selection purposes. The panel will evaluate each proposal against the requirements stated herein. The recommendation will be made to the respondent whose proposal represents the best overall fit and value to the City.

V. PAYMENT

<u>Invoices</u>: Invoices must be fully itemized, and provide sufficient information for approving payment and audit. Invoices must be accompanied by receipt for services in order for payment to be processed. Mail invoices to the Project Manager and reference the contract number.

<u>Payments</u>: The City will make payment to the vendor within 30 days of receipt of a correct and complete invoice.

VI. CITY REQUIREMENTS

A. Non-Discrimination Requirements:

Ordinance No. 5876-N.S. codified in B.M.C. Chapter 13.26 states that, for contracts worth more than \$3,000 bids for supplies or bids or proposals for services shall include a completed Workforce Composition Form. Businesses with fewer than five employees are exempt from submitting this form. (See B.M.C. 13.26.030)

Under B.M.C. section 13.26.060, the City may require any bidder or vendor it believes may have discriminated to submit a Non-Discrimination Program. The Contract Compliance Officer will make this determination. This applies to all contracts and all consultants (contractors). Berkeley Municipal Code section 13.26.070 requires that all contracts with the City contain a non-discrimination clause, in which the contractor agrees not to discriminate and allows the City access to records necessary to monitor compliance. This section also applies to all contracts and all consultants. **Bidders must submit the attached Non-Discrimination Disclosure Form with their proposal.**

B. Nuclear Free Berkeley Disclosure Form:

Berkeley Municipal Code section 12.90.070 prohibits the City from granting contracts to companies that knowingly engage in work for nuclear weapons. This contracting prohibition may be waived if the City Council determines that no reasonable alternative exists to doing business with a company that engages in nuclear weapons work. If your company engages in work for nuclear weapons, explain on the Disclosure Form the nature of such work. **Bidders must submit the attached Nuclear Free Disclosure Form with their proposal**.

C. Oppressive States:

The City of Berkeley prohibits granting of contracts to firms that knowingly provide personal services to specified Countries. This contracting prohibition may be waived if the City Council determines that no reasonable alternative exists to doing business with a company that is covered by City Council Resolution No. 59,853-N.S. If your company or any subsidiary is covered, explain on the Disclosure Form the nature of such work. **Bidders must submit the attached Oppressive States Disclosure Form with their proposal**.

D. Sanctuary City Contracting Ordinance:

Chapter 13.105 of the Berkeley Municipal Code prohibits the City from granting and or retaining contracts with any person or entity that provides Data Broker or Extreme Vetting services to the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement Division of the United States Department of Homeland Security ("ICE"). **Bidders must submit the attached Sanctuary City Compliance Statement with their proposal**.

E. Conflict of Interest:

In the sole judgment of the City, any and all proposals are subject to disqualification on the basis of a conflict of interest. The City may not contract with a vendor if the vendor or an employee, officer or director of the proposer's firm, or any immediate family member of the preceding, has served as an elected official, employee, board or commission member of the City who influences the making of the contract or has a direct or indirect interest in the contract.

Furthermore, the City may not contract with any vendor whose income, investment, or real property interest may be affected by the contract. The City, at its sole option, may disqualify any proposal on the basis of such a conflict of interest. Please identify any person associated with the firm that has a potential conflict of interest.

F. Berkeley Living Wage Ordinance:

Chapter 13.27 of the Berkeley Municipal Code requires that contractors offer all eligible employees with City mandated minimum compensation during the term of any contract that may be awarded by the City. If the Contractor is not currently subject to the Living Wage Ordinance, cumulative contracts with the City within a one-year period may subject Contractor to the requirements under B.M.C. Chapter 13.27. A certification of compliance with this ordinance will be required upon execution of a contract. The current Living Wage rate can be found here: https://www.cityofberkeley.info/Finance/Home/Vendors_Living_Wage_Ordinance.aspx. The Living Wage rate is adjusted automatically effective June 30th of each year commensurate with the corresponding increase in the Consumer Price Index published in April of each year. If the Living Wage rate is adjusted during the term of your agreement, you must pay the new adjusted rate to all eligible employees, regardless of what the rate was when the contract was executed.

G. Berkeley Equal Benefits Ordinance:

Chapter 13.29 of the Berkeley Municipal Code requires that contractors offer domestic partners the same access to benefits that are available to spouses. A certification of compliance with this ordinance will be required upon execution of a contract.

H. Statement of Economic Interest:

The City's Conflict of Interest Code designates "consultants" as a category of persons who must complete Form 700, Statement of Economic Interest, at the beginning of the contract period and again at the termination of the contract. The selected contractor will be required to complete the Form 700 before work may begin.

VII. <u>OTHER REQUIREMENTS</u>

A. Insurance

The selected contractor will be required to maintain general liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$2,000,000, automobile liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 and a professional liability insurance policy in the amount of \$2,000,000 to cover any claims arising out of the performance of the contract. The general liability and automobile insurance must name the City, its officers, agents, volunteers and employees as additional insured.

<u>Insurance not Necessary:</u> If the services are such that the risk of exposure to liability is very low, insurance may not be required. An example of such a service is an individual using his/her computer at home to lay out a newsletter for the City. This determination must be made by the Risk Manager in writing before the RFP is issued.

Insurance Waiver: A situation in which insurance is not necessary is different from a case in which insurance may be waived. An insurance waiver is appropriate where insurance would usually be necessary but when, as a policy matter, the City is willing to take the risk of allowing an uninsured or under-insured individual or business to perform the work (usually when the risk of liability is low). An insurance waiver may be granted only by the Risk Manager in writing with the approval of the City Manager. If a potential bidder expresses an inability to meet the insurance requirement, he or she should be encouraged to contact the Project Manager & Risk Manager for assistance in obtaining insurance.)

B. Worker's Compensation Insurance:

A selected contractor who employs any person shall maintain workers' compensation insurance in accordance with state requirements. Sole proprietors with no employees are not required to carry Worker's Compensation Insurance.

C. Business License

Virtually every contractor that does business with the City must obtain a City business license as mandated by B.M.C. Ch. 9.04. The business license requirement applies whether or not the contractor has an office within the City limits. However, a "casual" or "isolated" business transaction (B.M.C. section 9.04.010) does not subject the contractor to the license tax. Warehousing businesses and charitable organizations are the only entities specifically exempted in the code from the license requirement (see B.M.C. sections, 9.04.295 and 9.04.300). Non-profit organizations are granted partial exemptions (see B.M.C. section 9.04.305). Persons who, by reason of physical infirmity, unavoidable misfortune, or unavoidable poverty, may be granted an exemption of one annual free license at the discretion of the Director of Finance (see B.M.C. sections 9.04.290).

Vendor must apply for a City business license and show proof of application to General Services Manager within seven days of being selected as intended contractor.

The Customer Service Division of the Finance Department located at 1947 Center Street, Berkeley, CA 94704, issues business licenses. Contractors should contact this division for questions and/or information on obtaining a City business license, in person, or by calling 510-981-7200.

D. Recycled Paper

Any printed reports for the City required during the performance of the work shall be on 100% recycled paper, and shall be *printed on both sides of the page* whenever practical.

E. State Prevailing Wage:

Certain labor categories under this project may be subject to prevailing wages as identified in the State of California Labor Code commencing in Section 1770, et seq. These labor categories, when employed for any "work performed during the design and preconstruction phases of construction including, but not limited to, inspection and land surveying work," constitute a "Public Work" within the definition of Section 1720(a)(1) of the California Labor Code requiring payment of prevailing wages.

Occupational Categories

Officials and Administrators - Occupations in which employees set broad policies, exercise overall responsibility for execution of these policies, or provide specialized consultation on a regional, district or area basis. Includes: department heads, bureau chiefs, division chiefs, directors, deputy superintendents, unit supervisors and kindred workers.

Professionals - Occupations that require specialized and theoretical knowledge that is usually acquired through college training or through work experience and other training that provides comparable knowledge. Includes: personnel and labor relations workers, social workers, doctors, psychologists, registered nurses, economists, dietitians, lawyers, systems analysts, accountants, engineers, employment and vocational rehabilitation counselors, teachers or instructors, and kindred workers.

Technicians - Occupations that require a combination of basic scientific or technical knowledge and manual skill that can be obtained through specialized post-secondary school education or through equivalent on-the-job training. Includes: bookkeepers, messengers, office machine operators, clerk-typists, stenographers, court transcribers, hearings reporters, statistical clerks, dispatchers, license distributors, payroll clerks, and kindred workers.

Skilled Craft Workers - Occupations in which workers perform jobs which require special manual skill and a thorough and comprehensive knowledge of the processes involved in the work which is acquired through on-thejob training and experience or through apprenticeship or other formal training programs. Includes: mechanics and repairpersons, electricians, heavy equipment operators, stationary engineers, skilled machining occupations, carpenters, compositors and typesetters, and kindred workers.

Service/Maintenance - Occupations in which workers perform duties which result in or contribute to the comfort, convenience, hygiene or safety of the general public or which contribute to the upkeep and care of buildings, facilities or grounds of public property. Workers in this group may operate machinery. Includes: chauffeurs, laundry and dry cleaning operatives, truck drivers, bus drivers, garage laborers, custodial personnel, gardeners and groundskeepers, refuse collectors, and construction laborers.
