WHEREAS,	Carl C. Anthony & Dr. M. Paloma Pavel have provided more than four decades of inspirational multiracial leadership, social innovation, and dedicated service in the communities of Berkeley, the San Francisco Bay Area, the State of California, and the larger world in areas of environmental, climate and racial justice; and
WHEREAS,	Carl C. Anthony & Dr. M. Paloma Pavel are celebrating 20 years since they co-founded the Breakthrough Communities Communities Project, (beginning in in 1990) to strengthen voice and vision in disadvantaged communities, and 30 years since the founding of Earth House Center dedicated to local and global reach; and
WHEREAS,	Carl C. Anthony, a trained architect, has provided strategic guidance to the reimagining of what our cities can be; and
WHEREAS,	Dr. M Paloma Pavel, trained as a psychologist, has devoted her life and work to the transformational healing of individuals, organizations, and communities as well as protecting our living body of earth; and
WHEREAS,	together their work as educators, authors and community advocates is documented in such social movement-building works as: The Earth, the City and the Hidden Narrative of Race (2017); Breakthrough Communities: Sustainability and Justice in the Next American Metropolis (MIT Press 2009); and Climate Justice: Frontline Stories from Groundbreaking Coalitions in California (2018); and
WHEREAS,	their work has also served to build a spiritual foundation for Beloved Communities through faith-based organizing, Caring for Creation across interfaith and spiritual boundaries, and developing new forms of chaplaincy, including the publishing of Random Kindness and Senseless Acts of Beauty with a foreword by Archbishop Desmond Tutu - (named Peacemaker book of the year, 2017).
