RECYCLING WIN

Ever wonder what happens to your old carpet when you discard it? Up until recently, it would go to the landfill.

The City of Berkeley's Zero Waste Division received a \$14,000 grant to secure the resources necessary to recycle carpet. Staff started collecting carpets last September and are thrilled to report that they successfully diverted seven tons (14,000 pounds) of carpet from the landfill and to a recycling facility.



LOBBYIST REGISTRATION ORDINANCE

The new Lobbyist Registration Ordinance became effective January 1, 2020. The City Clerk Department, City Attorney's Office, and Open Government Commission have been working diligently to implement the ordinance from an administrative and operational standpoint as well as reaching out to the regulated community. City staff has sent informational materials to community agencies funded by the City, arts organizations, business groups, commissioners, employees, and elected officials. Public display signs have been placed at 2180 Milvia Street in the lobby and 5th Floor, 1947 Center Street in the lobby and the Permit Service Center, at the Public Safety Building, and will be displayed at all City Council Meetings.
