- Re: CARE program provides energy bill discounts to low-income, furloughed and unemployed residents

Due to the economic hardship caused by COVID-19, East Bay Community Energy (EBCE), our local electricity provider, is encouraging residents to apply for the <u>California</u> <u>Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) discount program</u> if they have been recently furloughed or laid-off from their jobs. Many local residents may not realize that they now qualify for substantially discounted home energy rates.

The CARE program provides qualifying low-income customers a 35% discount on their electricity bill and a 20% discount on their natural gas bill. The CARE Program, paid for by all customers in California, is administered by PG&E and is available to EBCE customers. EBCE has developed resources on its website (<u>https://ebce.org/care/</u>) to help customers enroll in the CARE program.
