Re: Promoting Weekly Electric Vehicle Workshops

The Planning Department's Office of Energy and Sustainable Development (OESD) is partnering with the non-profit <u>Drive Clean Bay Area</u> (DCBA) to co-sponsor an ongoing series of weekly electric vehicle (EV) workshops. Each month DCBA is hosting three "<u>EV 101</u>" workshops that explore the many benefits of electric cars (improved air quality, lower maintenance and fueling costs, reduced carbon emissions, etc.) as well as incentives and special programs for income-qualified drivers that make electric car ownership more affordable. The EV 101 workshop, called "Electrify Your Ride," also touches briefly on electric bikes. Additionally, once a month, DCBA is hosting an "<u>EV 102</u>" workshop geared to new EV drivers to learn how they can claim incentives, navigate charging, and reduce energy bills by switching to a special EV rate. Interested community members can register now to participate in any of these workshops.

The weekly workshops provide an intimate setting where participants can ask questions and talk candidly with current EV drivers. Transportation is the largest source of greenhouse gas emissions in Berkeley. Electric vehicle education supports the City's <u>Climate Action Plan</u> and Fossil Fuel Free goals by encouraging electric vehicle adoption, as well as supports City Council's recent <u>referral</u> to explore how the City of Berkeley could ban the sale of gas vehicles sooner than the State's goal of 2035. The <u>2020 Electric Mobility Roadmap</u> also identifies consumer education as a strategy to eliminate emissions from private vehicles.
