RECOMMENDATION

Conduct a public hearing and upon conclusion, adopt a Resolution approving new fees and increasing current fees for select Marina fees; and rescinding Resolution No. 71,840-N.S. and all amendatory resolutions.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF RECOMMENDATION

The cumulative impact of these fee increases is estimated to add \$247,500 in annual revenue to the Marina Fund (Fund 608), which supports Waterfront operations including the Marina, facilities, roads, recreation programs and special events, (see Table 1). These increases are needed to offset the costs of providing these services and to help ensure the long-term financial sustainability of the Waterfront. As discussed at the Council Budget & Finance Policy Committee meeting on October 28, 2025, the Marina Fund has had operating deficits for several years, and the Council has had to address these shortfalls with a variety of General Fund balancing measures.¹ The Marina Fund was buoyed by the passage of the 2024 Parks Tax increase, which shifted more than \$1.5M in costs for Waterfront parks and landscaped areas off the Marina Fund. However, the weak recovery of the regional hotel market since COVID has created significant uncertainty for the Marina Fund's single largest revenue source, the Doubletree Hotel.

These fee increases are needed as one part of the City's strategy to balance the Marina Fund in the next budget cycle. Other measures include Waterfront recreation fee increases², revenue from updated Waterfront leases, and increased berth occupancy at the Marina. If these fees are not adopted, the Marina Fund is likely to generate deficits which will either require additional reductions to address any shortfall or additional General Fund subsidy which may not be feasible given the projected fiscal constraints of the General Fund.

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

On June 24, 2025, Council adopted an updated Marina fee (Resolution No. 71,840-N.S.). The City regularly reviews all Marina fees in an effort to keep facilities and infrastructure accessible to the public while accounting for increased costs to deliver those services. Proposed fee changes described below are proposed to go into effect January 28, 2026, unless otherwise noted.

- **Berth Fees** are the monthly slip fee for slipholders with a permit to berth. Fees are proposed to increase by 3% for each of the next two years: a 3% increase in FY27, and a 3% increase in FY28. This is to better recover operational costs, while staying competitive with the local market for slips, (see Tables 2 and 3).

- Power Surcharge:** All slip holders on unmetered slips (slips that are not separately metered for power by Pacific Gas and Electric Company) currently pay an additional 0-12% on top of their monthly dockage to partially offset the costs of the electric bills paid by the City for various docks. This fee would add an additional 40% per month to the existing power surcharges for unmetered slips to offset the cost of power.

Slipholders with unmetered power have not been subject to a power fee increase since 2015. This fee would account for a portion of the increased cost of power paid for by the Marina for these unmetered slips. Since the time this fee was established, power costs for the Marina have increased by over 100%. Raising the fee by this much would cause a significant increase to slip fees for unmetered slips, so a 40% increase is being proposed, (see Table 4).

- Liveaboard Fees** are applied to permits for cruising vessels used as a residence, and thirteen floating homes in the Berkeley Marina. This fee is proposed to increase from \$220/month to \$270/month. This liveaboard fee increase is in place to offset staff costs of administering this permit, including the liveaboard waitlist. The fee also offsets the additional usage of Marina facilities by a full-time resident at an otherwise recreational facility. Even with the proposed fee increase, Berkeley’s fees are the lowest among neighboring marinas, (see Table 5).

- Launch ramp fees** are charged for access to the Marina launch ramp and parking lot. The fees are proposed to increase from \$17 to \$20/day; from \$95 to \$120/month; and \$310 to \$400 for a seasonal pass. This fee has not been increased since 2019 and is needed to help offset the costs of maintenance and management of the Launch Ramp facilities. This fee is consistent with local Marinas, (see Table 6).

- New Customer Discount.** Currently, new customers who sign up before September receive two months of free dockage (slip fees) in December and January, along with a \$75 gift card to a Berkeley Waterfront business. To improve marketing and simplify implementation of the incentive, this discount is proposed to change to: two months free after the initial two months are paid. This has no fiscal impact but may help recruit new boaters.
- Waterfront Special Event Fees** established in 2020 are working well for non-ticketed events. In 2025, \$28,722 in fees was received from 11 special events. The fees and process help external event producers clearly understand the costs of producing events at the Waterfront, facilitate fair and consistent application of the fees, and offset the impact of these events. There are two changes proposed to the existing fees outlined in Table 7 below.
- Ticket fees for gated events would remain at 10% of gross ticket sales, but the calculation would change to match San Francisco's recently updated method of assessing the fee on gross ticket sales less special event fees.
- Concession fees would be reduced from 10% to 3% of gross concession sales, to remain competitive with our neighboring jurisdictions. San Francisco charges

5% of concessions. East Bay Regional Park District charges the greater of \$75 or 10% of vendor sales at the event but does not charge ticket fees. Oakland does not charge for ticket or concession fees.

- Additional Waterfront Parking Passes.** A new fee of \$200 is proposed for additional boater and tenant parking passes to park in Waterfront lots. Each Waterfront business will receive a predetermined number of free passes based on annual revenue and employee need. Additional passes for tenant staff and slipholders may be purchased for \$200/pass. The fee is needed to offset costs to maintain Waterfront parking lots and infrastructure.

BACKGROUND

The Marina Fund covers all Waterfront operations including the Marina, landscaping, facilities, parks, roads, recreation programs and special events. Specific examples include the daily maintenance of over 1,000 berths, repairs to docks, pilings and buildings, staffing in Shorebird Nature Center and Adventure playground and the daily administration of what essentially is a “small city”. These costs are paid via revenues from berth fees, special fees, and commercial leases and licenses. Berth fees comprise 46% of all Marina Fund revenue, while all other marina fees combined comprise approximately 9% of Marina Fund revenue.

The proposed fees were brought before the Parks, Recreation & Waterfront Commission on November 12, 2025 at their regular meeting. These fees along with a range of financial alternatives to fiscally stabilize the Marina Fund were presented to the Council Budget & Finance Policy Committee on October 28, 2025.³

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

The proposed fee increases will improve the City’s ability to manage and operate the Berkeley Waterfront, where the City provides unique recreational and educational opportunities for the community to engage with and learn about the Bay and local marine environment.

ESTABLISHING FEES FOR GOODS AND SERVICES PROVIDED AT THE
BERKELEY MARINA AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 71,840-N.S.

WHEREAS, on June 24, 2025, Council adopted the new Marina Fee Schedule (Resolution No. 71,840-N.S.); and

WHEREAS, the City's costs to operate facilities, provide services and undertake capital improvements at the Berkeley Marina have increased with inflation, rising staff costs, and aging infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Marina fees are required to offset those costs and the additional revenue will be deposited in the Marina Fund (608); and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Berkeley that the attached rate structure (Exhibit A) is hereby established for use by the general public for facilities and services at the Berkeley Marina, effective January 28, 2026.
