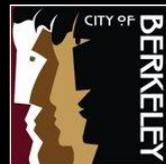

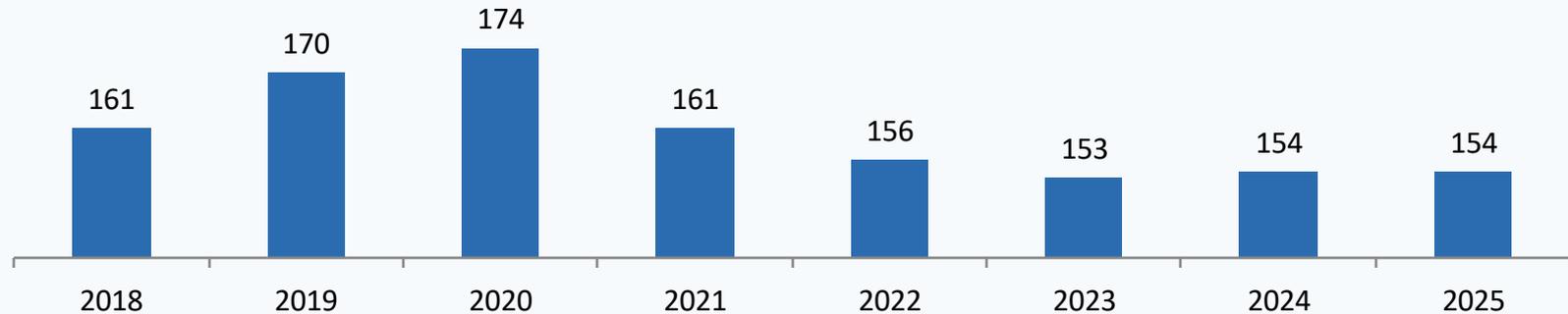

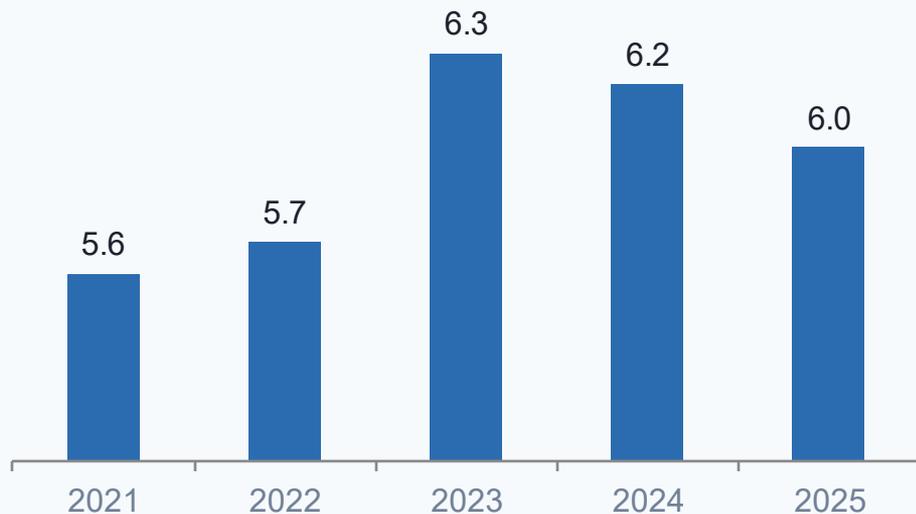

## Key Initiatives

### CritiCall Assessment

Pre-employment test candidates complete on their own time. Directs resources toward strongest candidates.

### Call Taker Position

New entry-level role gives recruits a manageable starting point. Early results show higher training completion rates.

### Protocol-Based Dispatching

Standardized call-handling procedures being finalized to improve training, reduce stress, and increase efficiency.

### Virtual Agent Exploration

Exploring AI triage for non-emergency calls to reduce routine volume for dispatchers.

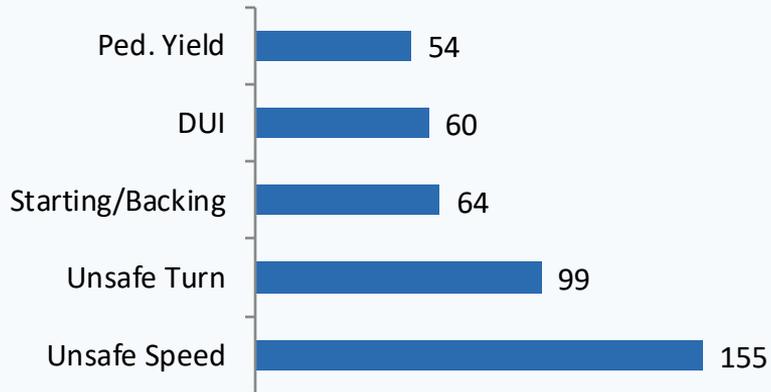

## Enforcement Alignment

Strong overlap between the violations officers enforce and the behaviors causing collisions.

In 2026, BPD is acquiring 5 new LIDAR units and expanding speed enforcement training into patrol to increase coverage at high-collision intersections.

## Use of Force

# 0.46%

of calls involved any force

0.07% involved Level 3 or 4 force (45 incidents)

93% of all force was Level 1 or 2

## Tests for Bias

- ✓ **Collision Demographics:** Strong alignment with stops
- ✓ **Veil of Darkness:** Consistent across light/dark
- ✓ **Yield Rate Analysis:** 61% overall; no indications of bias
- ✓ **Force Rate by Race:** Consistent across groups

*We can't hire our way out of the staffing gap overnight. But we can match the right resources to the right problems.*



## Community Connection

GVIPP/GVROs → zero fatal/injury shootings

CSOs → 1,500 calls off patrol's plate

Vision Zero → 11% fewer collisions

# Gun Violence Accountability & Prevention

## A dual approach: prevention meets enforcement

### GVIPP

Life coaching, mentorship, and direct support for at-risk individuals. Scene response and hospital visits after incidents.

### Live Free

Community-based organization providing violence intervention and community mediation.

### NICJR

National Institute for Criminal Justice Reform — strategic advisors and evaluation.

BPD works with GVIPP to connect impacted individuals and families to support services and hold offenders accountable while investing in the community conditions that prevent violence.

# Reimagining Public Safety

## Community Service Officers in Patrol

The CSO patrol program shifts work that doesn't require a sworn officer is one of the most concrete examples of Reimagining Public Safety in practice.

**1,500+** calls handled by 3 patrol CSOs in their first year

### What's Next

- Additional CSOs transferring to patrol in 2026
- Expanding CSO roles into investigations (evidence collection, report prep)

### Part of a Bigger Picture

The CSO program builds a more community-centered approach. The core goal: shifting work that doesn't require a sworn officer to more appropriate resources. Their results in 2025 show the model works.

## How It Works

The Flex Team uses crime data and partnerships with local businesses and loss prevention teams to run proactive operations that catch suspects during the act. Apprehending people in the act significantly increases the likelihood of successful prosecution.

## Beyond Retail Theft

- Identity additional crimes
- Outstanding warrants for kidnapping, carjacking
- 2 illegally possessed firearms recovered
- 42% on probation/parole or Prop 36 eligible

**In 2026, BPD is allocating 3 dedicated officer positions to the Flex Team.**

# Vision Zero & Traffic Safety Partnerships

## Multi-Agency Enforcement

High Intensity Traffic Team (HITT) operations brought together 11 local law enforcement agencies, 17 officers and produced 185 citations.

## Expanded DUI Checkpoints

Increased frequency and visibility of DUI checkpoints using OTS grant funding, guided by collision data.

## Drive Safer, Drive Longer

Four classes at North and South Berkeley Senior Centers, helping aging drivers maintain mobility and independence while staying safe.

## Data-Driven Strategy

Collision data from the Transparency Hub and the Traffic Concern Survey guides where and when enforcement resources are deployed. Community input directly shapes our operational priorities.

**Result: Total collisions down 11% (877 → 784)**

## For Patrol

Real-time alerts when stolen or felony-linked vehicles enter the city. Officers respond with confirmed information rather than suspicion. More targeted stops, less risk for everyone.

## For Investigations

Historical plate data lets detectives track vehicle movements, build timelines, and link cases across incidents.

## Regional Networks

Historical plate data lets detectives track vehicle movements, build timelines, and link cases across incidents.

**Robbery clearance rate: 34% → 49%, reflecting the impact of ALPR-supported investigations.**

# What's Next: Public Safety Technology

*A comprehensive, integrated public safety technology program presented in detail in the next agenda item.*

## Real-Time Information Center

Centralized hub where camera feeds, plate data, and aerial footage are monitored and relayed to officers in the field.

## Fixed Video Cameras

Solar-powered PTZ cameras at high-pedestrian intersections. Objective video evidence and real-time awareness.

## Drone as First Responder

Eyes on scene in minutes. Aerial video before officers arrive enables better decisions and safer outcomes.

When our officers have better tools and better information, outcomes improve. These gains came from putting the right technology and strategy behind the people we already have.

- ✔ Sustain gun violence prevention through GVIPP and enforcement partnerships
- ✔ Expand CSO patrol program and Flex Team with dedicated positions
- ✔ Continue building a sustainable Communications Center
- ✔ Deepen Vision Zero collaboration and traffic safety enforcement
- ✔ Advance public safety technology: ALPR renewal, cameras, DFR program
