This meeting will be conducted in accordance with the Brown Act, Government Code Section 54953 and applicable Executive Orders as issued by the Governor that are currently in effect. Any member of the public may attend this meeting. Questions regarding public participation may be addressed to the City Clerk Department (510) 981-6900. The City Council may take action related to any subject listed on the Agenda.

Pursuant to the City Council Rules of Procedure and State Law, the presiding officer may remove, or cause the removal of, an individual for disrupting the meeting. Prior to removing an individual, the presiding officer shall warn the individual that their behavior is disrupting the meeting and that their failure to cease their behavior may result in their removal. The presiding officer may then remove the individual if they do not promptly cease their disruptive behavior. "Disrupting" means engaging in behavior during a meeting of a legislative body that actually disrupts, disturbs, impedes, or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting and includes, but is not limited to, a failure to comply with reasonable and lawful regulations adopted by a legislative body, or engaging in behavior that constitutes use of force or a true threat of force.

Consent Calendar

At any time during, or immediately after, public comment on Information and Consent items, any Councilmember may move any Information or Consent item to “Action.” Following this, the Council will vote on the items remaining on the Consent Calendar in one motion.

For items moved to the Action Calendar from the Consent Calendar or Information Calendar, persons who spoke on the item during the Consent Calendar public comment period may speak again at the time the matter is taken up during the Action Calendar.

Public Comment on Consent Calendar and Information Items Only: *The Council will take public comment on any items that are either on the amended Consent Calendar or the Information Calendar. Speakers will be entitled to two minutes each to speak in opposition to or support of Consent Calendar and Information Items. A speaker may only speak once during the period for public comment on Consent Calendar and Information items.*

Additional information regarding public comment by City of Berkeley employees and interns: Employees and interns of the City of Berkeley, although not required, are encouraged to identify themselves as such, the department in which they work and state whether they are speaking as an individual or in their official capacity when addressing the Council in open session or workshops.

Subject: Confirming the Results of the May 28, 2024, Special Municipal Election

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a Resolution confirming the results of the May 28, 2024 Special Municipal Election for City Council District 4.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF RECOMMENDATION

There are no fiscal impacts associated with confirming the election results.

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

The Alameda County Registrar of Voters has submitted to the City Clerk the official Statement of Votes Cast for the City of Berkeley Special Municipal Election held on May 28, 2024, and the City Clerk has prepared the attached Certification of Election Results.

The attached Resolution confirms the results of the May 28, 2024 Election and declares Igor Tregub as the candidate elected to the office of City Council District 4.

For the certified results, the votes in the precinct count are reflected as being lower than the votes in the RCV report. This is due to how votes are reported at the precinct level versus how they are reported after the RCV algorithm is applied. The results in the precinct count reflect how many voters marked their vote for a candidate in the first choice column. The RCV report takes into account “advanced votes,” which are tabulated when the RCV algorithm is used. An example of an advanced vote scenario would be if a voter left their first choice column blank, but then voted for Igor Tregub in the second choice column. When the ROV runs the RCV algorithm, the vote in the second choice column is “advanced” to the first choice column. This is how the system has worked since its inception in 2010 and is the proper outcome in these scenarios.

The table below reflects the votes each candidate received in the precinct count versus the RCV report. The RCV report includes “advanced votes”, whereas the precinct count does not.

BACKGROUND

With the resignation of Councilmember Harrison on February 23, 2024, a vacancy was created in the office of City Councilmember for District 4. The District 4 seat is on the regular rotation to be filled at the 2026 municipal election. According to the City Charter (Article V, Section 12) if there is more than one year remaining on the term of the vacant seat, the City Council must call a special election to fill the vacancy within 10 days of the occurrence of the vacancy (February 23). On February 29, the Council called for the special election to be held on May 28.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY AND CLIMATE IMPACTS

There are no identifiable environmental and climate effects or opportunities associated with confirming the election results.


