
Located near Grove Park, the Martin Luther King Jr. Youth Services Center/Young Adult Project (Y.A.P.) houses various afterschool and summer recreation programs such as tutoring, violence prevention and leadership development for teens and young adults. This project is for the planning, design and construction of a seismic retrofit and renovation of the Y.A.P. Center to become a Care and Shelter facility, modernize the facility, and meet accessibility standards.

T1 Bond Funding: \$7,000,000
FEMA HMGP Grant (waiting for award status): \$1,237,500
Total Anticipated Project Budget: \$8,237,500
