The City of Berkeley is soliciting written proposals from qualified firms or individuals to provide on-call vegetation management and reduction for the Parks Division. As a Request for Proposal (RFP) this is <u>not</u> an invitation to bid and although price is very important, other factors will be taken into consideration.

The project scope, content of proposal, and vendor selection process are summarized in the RFP (attached). Proposals must be received no later than 2:00 pm, on Tuesday, March 14, 2023. Corresponding pricing proposal shall be submitted as a separate document with the filename saved as, "Pricing Vendor Name – 23-11560-C On-Call Vegetation Management and Reduction Services."

INTRODUCTION

The City of Berkeley (the "City") Parks Division maintains City parks and open spaces and is soliciting proposals from vendors who wish to be included on the City's On-Call Vegetation Management and Reduction Contractor List to perform various vegetation maintenance tasks on an as-needed basis. It is the City's intent to enter into three contracts with landscape maintenance contractors for On-Call Vegetation Management Services for an initial contract of (3) years, with a possible two (2) year contract extension.

Contractors should expect work may be on a variety of conditions, on steep slopes, and in areas with high traffic and areas with limited access. The vendor must provide all labor, supervision, implements, tools, machinery, safety equipment, traffic control, materials, and proper licensing as required for on-call hazardous vegetation/fuels management services.

II. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The scope of services is for a three (3) year term, with the option of a two (2) year extension for an amount not to exceed \$1,200,000 with no guaranteed minimum. This is an on-call contract and all work will be requested by the City in writing (email) and must be responded to in writing (email). The primary objectives of this contract are for hazardous vegetation/fire fuels reduction, enhanced site line visibility, and aesthetics.

- Contractor shall disclose to the "City" all labor, materials, equipment, tools, implements, machinery, incidentals, transportation, methods and processes necessary and required for the performance of all hazardous vegetation/fire fuels reduction.
- Length of Contract(s) The work is scheduled to begin on May 22, 2023 and must be completed March 22, 2028.
- Site Visit and Investigation It is the Contractor's responsibility to make a thorough investigation of the work sites as a basis for the submittal of competitive bids. The Contractor shall examine the locations of the proposed work sites to fully become acquainted with the specifications and the nature of the work to be done. Contractor shall have no claim against the City in the occurrence of inadequate site evaluations.
- The primary objectives of this contract are to use manual and powered tools to reduce surface ladder fuels, string trim weeds and grasses to native soil, prune shrubs, cut and thin stands of trees to specifications; chip limbs, brush and trees; and haul debris from sites, prepare and/or amend soil for planting, plant to specifications; all while giving attention to passing pedestrian, bicycle, and vehicular traffic.

Dead Vegetation

- Cut annual grasses and or weeds
- Prune dead twigs and limbs from trees
- Remove grass and weed clippings
- Remove foliage, dead twigs, diseased and dying shrubs from groundcover
- Remove leaf or needle litter and or vegetation piles
- Remove small diameter (less than 4" diameter) dead trees

Live Vegetation

- Prune tree branches 6-8 feet above ground
- Ladder fuels: prune and reduce ground vegetation from under trees to provide a vertical separation of three times the height of the understory
- Remove brush or shrubs that extend into roadways and walkways

Other Vegetation

- Remove Eucalyptus slash/debris from trunk up to 8 feet from the ground surface.
- Remove fallen limbs, logs, piles of slash, and other debris from the forest floor
- Remove saplings from stumps
- Prepare and amend soil for planting
- Planting plants to be installed will be determined by specifications supplied by City staff. Plants will be supplied by City staff.

PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK FOR MANDATORY PRE-PROPOSAL TOUR

*Staging area at front of Remillard Park, 80 Poppy Lane. Please note that specified areas include steep grade, various terrain, and will require hand work.

- 1. **Remillard Park, 80 Poppy Lane, Berkeley, CA 94708**. Use powered and hand tools to reduce fuel ladder ad surface fuels surrounding trees. Thin forest stands up to specified tree diameters or spacing between trees; create spacing between specified shrub. Haul logs and chips off site. String trim gasses and weeds.
- 2. Cragmont Park, 960 Regal Road, Berkeley, CA 94708. Use powered and hand tools to reduce fuel ladder and surface fuels surrounding trees. Thin forest stands up to specified tree diameters or spacing between trees; create spacing between specified shrub. Haul logs and chips off site. String trim gasses and weeds. Clear switchbacks of vegetation.
- 3. Codornices Park, 1201 Euclid Ave., Berkeley, CA 94708. Use powered and hand tools to reduce fuel ladder ad surface fuels surrounding trees. Thin forest stands up to specified tree diameters or spacing between trees; create spacing between specified shrub. Haul logs and chips off site. String trim gasses and weeds. Clear switchbacks of vegetation.
- 4. The San Francisco Bay Trail from the Berkeley border (just north of Emeryville) to Gilman Avenue. Use powered and hand tools to cut weeds down to the native soil on either side of the asphalt path. Prune vegetation back from the edge of the asphalt pathway and road.

General Requirements

- 1. Contractor shall maintain pedestrian and vehicular traffic control at all times in accordance with the "Manual of Traffic Controls" issues by the State of California, Department of Transportation. No additional payment will be made to the Contractor for traffic control. See: http://www.dot.ca.gov/trafficops/camutcd/camutcd2014rev4.html
- 2. Contractor shall post "no parking" signs no later than 72 hours in advance of the time of need. Pedestrian's access to homes and businesses in the project area shall be maintained at all times. No additional payment will be made to the Contractor for posting "no parking" signs and for maintaining residential and business access.
- 3. The Contractor must request permission from the Project Manager prior to towing any vehicles that may interfere with the Contractor's progress.
- 4. Contractor shall at all times observe and comply with, and shall cause all agents and employees to observe and comply with all such laws, ordinances, regulations, orders and decrees, including all provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1979 and all amendment thereto, an all applicable federal, state, municipal and local safety regulations.
- 5. All work which is defective in its implementation or deficient in any of the requirements of these specifications, shall be remedied, or removed and replaced by the Contractor in an acceptable manner, and no compensation will be allowed for such correction.

- 6. Contractor shall endeavor, whenever possible, to restrict the use of water. The Contractor shall, when necessary, at its own expense, provide all power and water necessary for the work. When necessary, the Contractor shall provide filter materials at the catch basin to retain any debris and dirt flowing into the City's drainage systems. Pollutants (any substance, material, or waste other than rainfall derived storm water) discharged to storm drains is strictly prohibited.
- 7. The contractor shall contact Underground Services Alert (USA) prior to excavation. Contractor must comply with all USA requirements. The Contractor shall be responsible for protecting the underground utilities that occur in the limits of the work.
- 8. The Contractor shall be responsible for the protection of public and private property adjacent to the work and shall exercise due caution to avoid damage to such property. The contractor shall be responsible for all damage to public and private property resulting from any work. Repairs and replacements shall be at least equal to existing improvements. Any damages to the private properties shall be restored to the satisfaction of the property owner and Project Manager within seven (7) days of the damage(s). All materials or installation methods to be used shall comply with local Water and Air Quality Management District and EPA codes and regulations. The Contractor shall comply with all City regulation including those regarding NPDES (National Pollution Discharge Elimination System) Requirements.
- 9. Maintain barricades and construction work signs for the duration of the work.
- 10. Properly protect areas by the approved coverings during operations as directed and necessary.
- 11. Remove all waste and debris from the area of work overnight.
- 12. The work done herein shall be in accordance with these plans, specifications and the latest edition of the Standards Specifications and Standard Plans of the State of California, Department of Transportation. It is the intent of this contract to obtain a finished, workmanlike job, complete in place.
- 13. Contractor shall abide by the City of Berkeley Noise Ordinance (Ord. 13.40.050), which specifies time limitations when engine-driven equipment may be operated. All construction machinery and vehicles employed on the project shall be equipped with approved sound-muffling devices, and operated in a manner to cause the least noise consistent with efficient performance of the work.
- 14. It shall be unlawful for any person, including any City employee, to operate any portable machine powered with a gasoline engine used to blow leaves, dirt, and other debris off sidewalks, driveways, lawns, or other surfaces within the City limits.
- 15. The daily work period shall not begin prior to 8:00 a.m.
- 16. Coordinated inspection will be scheduled between the contractor (s) and the City's Project Manager to discuss project site goals and to determine project completion. Inspections will be scheduled at:
 - Prior to the start of each project site.
 - o At the completion of each project site.
- 17. The project close-out and final retention payment (10%) shall require an acceptance of the Work, from the City's Project Manager.
- 18. Pending unforeseen weather complications, the Contractor and the City of Berkeley Project Manager, Melissa Marizette-Green, will select an alternate week for the work schedule to begin and continue if needed.

III. SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

All proposals shall include the following information, organized as separate sections of the proposal. The proposal should be concise and to the point.

1. Contractor Identification:

Provide the name of the firm, the firm's principal place of business, (see section VII, F. – Local Vendor Preference), the name and telephone number of the contact person, and company tax identification number.

2. Client References:

Provide a minimum of three (3) client references. Preferred references should be California cities or other large public sector entities. Provide the designated person's name, title, organization, address, telephone number, and the project(s) that were completed under that client's direction.

3. Price Proposal:

The proposal shall include pricing for all services. Pricing shall be all inclusive unless indicated otherwise. Pricing proposals shall be a separate document. The Proposal shall itemize all services, including hourly rates for all professional, technical and support personnel, and all other charges related to completion of the work shall be itemized. Evaluation of price proposals are subject to the local vendor business preference (see section VII.F.)

4. Contract Terminations:

If your organization has had a contract terminated in the last five (5) years, describe such incident. Termination for default is defined as notice to stop performance due to the vendor's non-performance or poor performance and the issue of performance was either (a) not litigated due to inaction on the part of the vendor, or (b) litigated and such litigation determined that the vendor was in default.

Submit full details of the terms for default including the other party's name, address, and phone number. Present the vendor's position on the matter. The City will evaluate the facts and may, at its sole discretion, reject the proposal on the grounds of the past experience.

If the firm has not experienced any such termination for default or early termination in the past five (5) years, so indicate.

IV. SELECTION CRITERIA

The following criteria will be considered, although not exclusively, in determining which firm is hired.

1. Qualifications & Availability 50%

2. Professional References 25%

3. Costs 25%

A selection panel will be convened of staff to evaluate and score submittals. Factors to be considered in selection process include:

1. Quality and thoroughness of proposal

- 2. Experience in providing similar scope of services for a public agency
- 3. Capacity to perform the work
- 4. Normal hours of availability
- 5. Guaranteed response time

* Effective 1/1/2022. Local Vendor Preference. For the purposes of comparing pricing as part of this competitive RFP for goods up to \$100,000 or non-professional services up to \$250,000, 5% shall be deducted from the bid price proposal from any local Berkeley vendor.

V. PAYMENT

<u>Invoices</u>: Invoices must be fully itemized, and provide sufficient information for approving payment and audit. Invoices must be accompanied by receipt for services in order for payment to be processed. **Email invoices to Accounts Payable and cc:** <u>mmarizettegreen@berkeleyca.gov</u>; (List on invoice, Attn: Melissa Marizette-Green/Parks, Recreation and Waterfront) and reference the contract number.

<u>Payments</u>: The City will make payment to the vendor within 30 days of receipt of a correct, approved and complete invoice.

VI. CITY REQUIREMENTS

A. Non-Discrimination Requirements

Ordinance No. 5876-N.S. codified in B.M.C. Chapter 13.26 states that, for contracts worth more than \$3,000 bids for supplies or bids or proposals for services shall include a completed Workforce Composition Form. Businesses with fewer than five employees are exempt from submitting this form. (See B.M.C. 13.26.030)

Under B.M.C. section 13.26.060, the City may require any bidder or vendor it believes may have discriminated to submit a Non-Discrimination Program. The Contract Compliance Officer will make this determination. This applies to all contracts and all consultants (contractors). Berkeley Municipal Code section 13.26.070 requires that all contracts with the City contain a non-discrimination clause, in which the contractor agrees not to discriminate and allows the City access to records necessary to monitor compliance. This section also applies to all contracts and all consultants.

Bidders must submit the attached Non-Discrimination Disclosure Form with their proposal.

B. Nuclear Free Berkeley Disclosure Form

Berkeley Municipal Code section 12.90.070 prohibits the City from granting contracts to companies that knowingly engage in work for nuclear weapons. This contracting prohibition may be waived if the City Council determines that no reasonable alternative exists to doing business with a company that engages in nuclear weapons work. If your company engages in work for nuclear weapons, explain on the Disclosure Form the nature of such work.

Bidders must submit the attached Nuclear Free Disclosure Form with their proposal.

C. Oppressive States

The City of Berkeley prohibits granting of contracts to firms that knowingly provide personal services to specified Countries. This contracting prohibition may be waived if the City Council determines that no reasonable alternative exists to doing business with a company that is covered by City Council Resolution Nos. 59,853-N.S., 60,382-N.S., and 70,606-N.S. If your company or any subsidiary is covered, explain on the Disclosure Form the nature of such work.

Bidders must submit the attached Oppressive States Disclosure Form with their proposal.

D. Sanctuary City Contracting Ordinance

Chapter 13.105 of the Berkeley Municipal Code prohibits the City from granting and or retaining contracts with any person or entity that provides Data Broker or Extreme Vetting services to the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement Division of the United States Department of Homeland Security ("ICE").

Bidders must submit the attached Sanctuary City Compliance Statement with their proposal.

E. Conflict of Interest

In the sole judgment of the City, any and all proposals are subject to disqualification on the basis of a conflict of interest. The City may not contract with a vendor if the vendor or an employee, officer or director of the proposer's firm, or any immediate family member of the preceding, has served as an elected official, employee, board or commission member of the City who influences the making of the contract or has a direct or indirect interest in the contract.

Furthermore, the City may not contract with any vendor whose income, investment, or real property interest may be affected by the contract. The City, at its sole option, may disqualify any proposal on the basis of such a conflict of interest.

Please identify any person associated with the firm that has a potential conflict of interest.

F. Berkeley Living Wage Ordinance

Chapter 13.27 of the Berkeley Municipal Code requires that contractors offer all eligible employees with City mandated minimum compensation during the term of any contract that may be awarded by the City. If the Contractor is not currently subject to the Living Wage Ordinance, cumulative contracts with the City within a one-year period may subject Contractor to the requirements under B.M.C. Chapter 13.27. A certification of compliance with this ordinance will be required upon execution of a contract. The current Living Wage rate can be found here: Information for Vendors | City of Berkeley (berkeleyca.gov). The Living Wage rate is adjusted automatically effective June 30th of each year commensurate with the corresponding increase in the Consumer Price Index published in April of each year. If the Living Wage rate is adjusted during the term of your agreement, you must pay the new adjusted rate to all eligible employees, regardless of what the rate was when the contract was executed.

G. Berkeley Equal Benefits Ordinance

Chapter 13.29 of the Berkeley Municipal Code requires that contractors offer domestic partners the same access to benefits that are available to spouses. A certification of compliance with this ordinance will be required upon execution of a contract.

H. Statement of Economic Interest

The City's Conflict of Interest Code designates "consultants" as a category of persons who must complete Form 700, Statement of Economic Interest, at the beginning of the contract period and again at the termination of the contract. The selected contractor will be required to complete the Form 700 before work may begin.

VII. OTHER REQUIREMENTS

A. Insurance

The selected contractor will be required to maintain general liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$2,000,000, automobile liability insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 and a professional liability insurance policy in the amount of \$2,000,000 to cover any claims arising out of the performance of the contract. The general liability and automobile insurance must name the City, its officers, agents, volunteers and employees as additional insured.

B. Worker's Compensation Insurance

A selected contractor who employs any person shall maintain workers' compensation insurance in accordance with state requirements. Sole proprietors with no employees are not required to carry Worker's Compensation Insurance.

C. Business License

Every contractor that does business with the City must obtain a City business license as mandated by B.M.C. Ch. 9.04. The business license requirement applies whether or not the contractor has an office within the City limits. However, a "casual" or "isolated" business transaction (B.M.C. section 9.04.010) does not subject the contractor to the license tax. Warehousing businesses and charitable organizations are the only entities specifically exempted in the code from the license requirement (see B.M.C. sections, 9.04.295 and 9.04.300). Non-profit organizations are granted partial exemptions (see B.M.C. section 9.04.305). Persons who, by reason of physical infirmity, unavoidable misfortune, or unavoidable poverty, may be granted an exemption of one annual free license at the discretion of the Director of Finance. (See B.M.C. sections 9.04.290).

Vendor must apply for a City business license and show proof of application to Purchasing Manager within seven days of being selected as intended contractor.

The Customer Service Division of the Finance Department located at 1947 Center Street, Berkeley, CA 94704, issues business licenses. Contractors should contact this division for questions and/or information on obtaining a City business license, in person, or by calling 510-981-7200.

D. Recycled Paper

Any printed reports for the City required during the performance of the work shall be on 100% recycled paper, and shall be *printed on both sides of the page* whenever practical.

E. State Prevailing Wage

Certain labor categories under this project may be subject to prevailing wages as identified in the State of California Labor Code commencing in Section 1770 et seq. These labor categories, when employed for any "work performed during the design and preconstruction phases of construction including, but not limited to, inspection

and land surveying work," constitute a "Public Work" within the definition of Section 1720(a)(1) of the California Labor Code requiring payment of prevailing wages.

F. Local Vendor Preference

City of Berkeley applies a local vendor preference for comparing pricing submittals in RFP responses (City Council Resolution No. 69,890-N.S.)

A **local business** is defined as "a business firm with fixed offices or distribution points located within the City of Berkeley boundaries and listed in the Permits and License Tax paid file, with a Berkeley business street address."

Management and

Officials and Administrators - Occupations in which employees set broad policies, exercise overall responsibility for execution of these policies, or provide specialized consultation on a regional, district or area basis. Includes: department heads, bureau chiefs, division chiefs, directors, deputy superintendents, unit supervisors and kindred workers.

Professionals - Occupations that require specialized and theoretical knowledge that is usually acquired through college training or through work experience and other training that provides comparable knowledge. Includes: personnel and labor relations workers, social workers, doctors, psychologists, registered nurses, economists, dietitians, lawyers, systems analysts, accountants, engineers, employment and vocational rehabilitation counselors, teachers or instructors, and kindred workers.

Office and Clerical - Occupations in which workers are responsible for internal and external communication, recording and retrieval of data and/or information and other paperwork required in an office. Includes: bookkeepers, messengers, office machine operators, clerk-typists, stenographers, court transcribers, hearings reporters, statistical clerks, dispatchers, license distributors, payroll clerks, and kindred workers.

Skilled Craft Workers - Occupations in which workers perform jobs which require special manual skill and a thorough and comprehensive knowledge of the processes involved in the work which is acquired through on-the-job training and experience or through apprenticeship or other formal training programs. Includes: mechanics and repairpersons, electricians, heavy equipment operators, stationary engineers, skilled machining occupations, carpenters, compositors and typesetters, and kindred workers.

Service/Maintenance - Occupations in which workers perform duties which result in or contribute to the comfort, convenience, hygiene or safety of the general public or which contribute to the upkeep and care of buildings, facilities or grounds of public property. Workers in this group may operate machinery. Includes: chauffeurs, laundry and dry-cleaning operatives, truck drivers, bus drivers, garage laborers, custodial personnel, gardeners and groundskeepers, refuse collectors, and construction laborers.
