
## BESO Resilience Upgrade Measure

### MEASURE INFORMATION

**Credits: 2** (50-75% replaced) **or 4** (76%+ replaced)

#### Description:

Replacing old single-pane windows, which provide little insulation and often lead to cold drafts, overheating, and higher energy bills, can improve your home's comfort and efficiency. Upgrading to double or triple-pane windows helps maintain indoor temperatures, reduces outside noise, and lowers heating and cooling costs. Look for ENERGY STAR or NFRC-rated models to ensure strong performance. Upgraded windows also improve resilience by keeping indoor temperatures more stable during extreme heat events and helping seal out wildfire smoke and outdoor air pollutants. New windows can be paired with air sealing measures to ensure that energy efficiency is maximized.



#### Installation Criteria:

Install high-performance windows to reduce energy loss and improve home comfort. Must replace at least 50% of window glazed. *(Credits will be scaled based on % of glazed area replaced)*

#### Required Verification Documentation:

- Permit + approved final inspection


