Item Description: FY 2019 Year-End Results and FY 2020 First Quarter Budget

Update

On Friday, November 22, 2019, the Budget & Finance Policy Committee (Committee) met and discussed the FY 2019 Year-End Results and FY 2020 First Quarter Budget Update. The Committee asked staff to submit the Mayor's budget allocation proposal as part of staff's supplemental item for the December 3, 2019, Council meeting (Exhibit A)¹. These items have been incorporated into the Amendment: FY 2019 Annual Appropriation Ordinance on tonight's agenda.

Included in the Mayor's proposal are allocation from FY 2019 unassigned property transfer tax and unassigned excess equity. Funding the allocations will require Council to temporarily suspend the funding allocations included in Council's Fiscal Policies. The Committee is planning to review the budget fiscal policies in a future meeting (Exhibit B).

In addition, during the Budget & Finance Policy meeting the Committee was provided revised material reflecting Council actions on November 19, 2019, (Attachment 2) as well as an updated list of the Council Budget Referrals (Exhibit C).

Council's Fiscal Policies

The fiscal policies adopted by the Council include:

- Focusing on the long-term fiscal health of the City by adopting a two-year budget and conducting multi-year planning;
- Building a prudent reserve;
- Developing long-term strategies to reduce unfunded liabilities;
- Controlling labor costs while minimizing layoffs;
- Allocating one-time revenue for one-time expenses;
- Requiring enterprise and grant funds to balance and new programs to pay for themselves; and
- ❖ Any new expenditure requires new revenue or expenditure reductions.
- ❖ Transfer Tax in excess of \$12.5 million will be treated as one-time revenue to be used for the City's capital infrastructure needs (Fund 501).
- ❖ As the General Fund subsidy to the Safety Members Pension Fund declines over the next several years, the amount of the annual decrease will be used to help fund the new Police Employee Retiree Health Plan (Fund 731).
- Starting in FY 2019, staff costs as approved by the City Council that exceed the enforcement fees and penalties shall be appropriated from the short term rental taxes collected pursuant to BMC Section 23C.22.050, Section H, with the primary allocation of the rental tax to the purposes listed below:

Proposed new policy:

Funding the 115 Pension Trust

On November 14, 2019, the Budget & Finance Policy Committee met to review and discuss the FY 2019 Year-End Results and FY 2020 First Quarter Budget Update, as well as the Amendment to the FY 2020 Annual Appropriations Ordinance (AAO#1). These reports were also presented to and discussed by the City Council on November 19, 2019. Based on these discussions, staff updated both the FY 2019 Property Transfer Tax schedule and the Council Budget Referrals spreadsheet. The updated summary of the excess property transfer tax allocations is reflected in the FY 2019 Property Transfer Tax chart on the next page. The updated list of the Council Budget Referrals spreadsheet is attached.

FY 2019 Property Transfer Tax

Staff removed the \$800,000 allocation for the 1951 Shattuck Traffic Signal. Staff added \$100,000 for the Dwight Triangle rehabilitation project and \$81,306 for the public art allocation tied to the Center Street Garage. In addition, a forgivable loan of \$150,000 was allocated to the Capoeira Arts Foundation.

Dwight Triangle Rehabilitation Project

Funds will be used to add planter areas to the traffic median at the southwest corner of the intersection of Telegraph Avenue and Dwight Way, in accordance with the Telegraph Public Realm Plan published in 2015. This will be implemented in partnership with and will leverage funds from the Telegraph Business Improvement District.

Center Street Garage - Public Art

The Center Street Garage was determined to be an eligible capital project for application of the City's Percent for Art policy. According to this policy, an amount equivalent to 1.5% of the project's construction costs should be dedicated to the production of publically accessible art projects, either on-site or off-site. The project's public art contribution was calculated based on the project's original budgeted amount; the total construction cost has since increased by \$5,420,418. Therefore an additional \$81,306 is required in order to bring the project into compliance with the policy.

Capoeira Arts Foundation

On November 19, 2019, Council approved a forgivable loan of \$150,000 for the benefit of the Capoeira Arts Foundation (CAF) to support their purchase of the Casa De Cultura – 1901 San Pablo Ave – in partnership with BrasArte to create a permanent home for their organizations, their school, the United Capoeira Association (UCA) Berkeley, and for other Brazilian art forms¹.
