

MOVE-IN AND MOVE-OUT

Got unwanted stuff? Confused about what goes where? Use the RE:Source guide at StopWaste.org for nearby reuse, repair, recycling and safe disposal options. Keep things out of the landfill by visiting these reusers and recyclers!



What Goes Where

- **Urban Ore** (urbanore.com) accepts building materials and household goods in usable condition.
- **Berkeley Recycling Center** (berkeleyrecycling.org) accepts gently used clothes and books, household batteries, lightbulbs and more.
- **E-Waste Collective** (ewastecollective.org) accepts electronic waste: TVs, computers, microwaves, cables & more.
- **Berkeley Transfer Station** (berkeleyca.gov/transferstation) accepts furniture, carpets, construction material and mattresses (first two free of charge, each additional is \$18. Must be free of mold, water and pests).

RESOURCES

- **Free Kitchen Food Scrap Pails and Reusable Produce Bags** Contact your property manager to request free trainings to receive kitchen food scrap pails.
- **Free Compost** Made from your curbside plant debris and food scraps. Available for pick-up year round at the Berkeley Marina. Bring your own shovels and containers.

- **Chose to Reuse** Save \$0.25 when you bring your own cup to Berkeley cafes and restaurants! (search "single-use foodware" at berkeleyca.gov.)
- **Shop local. Shop vintage.** Support your community and our earth.




HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE



RESIDENT OBLIGATIONS

The City of Berkeley's Zero Waste Division provides waste collection services for City residents, multifamily properties, and businesses.

Statewide Compost and Recycling Laws


Residential property managers and owners are required by law* to subscribe to landfill, recycling, and compost collection services, reduce waste, and educate employees, tenants, and contractors to sort properly. California state law SB 1383 went into effect on January 1, 2022, and aims to keep recyclable and compostable materials out of landfills to reduce emissions that contribute to climate change. In Alameda County, the law is implemented and enforced under the Organics Reduction and Recycling Ordinance in partnership with StopWaste.

4 TIPS TO COMPLY

- 1 Sort Properly**
 Residents must sort **compostable**, **cardboard/paper recycling**, **container recycling**, and landfill materials into the appropriate containers.
 
- 2 Alert your property manager or the City of Berkeley Customer Service at (510) 981-7270 if you observe improper waste sorting**
 Property managers are required to provide convenient access to all four waste streams with proper signage and training annually and at move-in and move-out.
 
- 3 Alert the City of Berkeley or Alameda County if there is no compost/recycling service available at your apartment**

- 4 Reduce Food Waste**
 Save Food. Save Money. Save the Environment (stopfoodwaste.org).

Clean, Dry Paper • Cardboard • Molded Fiber



Glass Bottles & Jars • Cans • Foil • Rigid Plastic Containers



Plastics: Bags, Film, Soft, Small, Crinkly • Multi-layered products such as Milk, Juice and Soup Cartons
Dish & Glassware • Diapers • Pet Waste



Compostable materials must be loose or placed in paper bags or newspaper.

Do not bag, place items loose in cart. Please flatten boxes.

Do not bag, place items loose in cart. Clean, empty and dry containers. Save water - wipe clean with spatula or napkin.

Any bag or bin liner type is accepted. No liquids.
