

CART SET OUT REQUIREMENTS

Property managers and owners are responsible for ensuring that carts are at the curb for pick-up by 7am on the scheduled service day. They must also ensure that carts are removed from the curb within 24 hours of pick-up. To report a missed pick up, please call Customer Service at (510) 981-7270 by 5pm the following day or visit berkeleyca.gov and search "Report Issue".

Property managers and owners are required to provide information to tenants about state law SB 1383, including the requirement to properly sort materials into **compost**, **container recycling**, **cardboard/paper recycling**, and **landfill** at least annually and at move-in and move-out. More information: stopwaste.org/rules.

Holiday Schedule
No collection service will be provided on Thanksgiving, Christmas or New Year's day. When the holiday lands on a weekday, collection will be one day later for rest of week.

What Goes Where

- **Urban Ore** (urbanore.com) accepts building materials and household goods in usable condition.
- **Berkeley Recycling Center** (berkeleyrecycling.org) accepts appliances, large recyclables, and more.
- **E-Waste Collective** (ewastecollective.org) accepts electronic waste.
- **Berkeley Transfer Station** (berkeleyca.gov/transferstation) accepts yard waste/landscaping debris, food scraps and food soiled paper for composting and refrigerated appliances, clean carpet, construction and demolition materials.



RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY MANAGER AND OWNER REQUIREMENTS

The City of Berkeley's Zero Waste Division provides waste collection services for City residents, multifamily properties, and businesses.

Statewide Compost and Recycling Laws
Residential property managers and owners are required by law* to subscribe to landfill, recycling, and compost collection services and to educate employees, tenants, and contractors to sort properly. California state law SB 1383 went into effect on January 1, 2022, and aims to keep recyclable and compostable materials out of landfills to reduce emissions that contribute to climate change. In Alameda County, the law is implemented and enforced under the Organics Reduction and Recycling Ordinance in partnership with StopWaste.

3 STEPS TO COMPLY

- 1 Sign up for compost and recycling collection service**
The authorized caller must contact the City of Berkeley Customer Service Center at 510-981-7270 to start or adjust **compost**, **cardboard/paper recycling**, and/or **container recycling** service.
- 2 Set up indoor bins with proper signage in waste/chute rooms and common areas**
Color-coded **compost**, **cardboard/paper recycling**, **container recycling** and landfill bins must be placed together for easy tenant access to all collection streams.
- 3 Educate facilities staff and tenants to sort properly and check bins periodically**
Property managers and owners must educate tenants, employees and contractors on regulations and proper sorting annually.

Plastics: Bags, Film, Soft, Small, Crinkly • Multi-layered products such as Milk, Juice and Soup Cartons
Dish & Glassware • Diapers • Pet Waste



Compostable materials must be loose or placed in paper bags or newspaper.

Do not bag, place items loose in cart. Please flatten boxes.

Do not bag, place items loose in cart. Clean, empty and dry containers. Save water - wipe clean with spatula or napkin.

Any bag or bin liner type is accepted. No liquids.
