#### Deadlines for Receipt:

- A) Staff will compile all Supplemental Materials and Supplemental Communications received by the deadlines above into a Supplemental Packet, and will print 15 copies of this packet for the Commission meeting.

6. Discussion and Possible Action on Recommendations for Measure P Funding.

**Action**: M/S/C Scheider/Marasovic the Homeless Services Panel of Experts strongly supports the 1367 University Ave Step Up Housing Project to provide needed housing. HSPE recommends that one-fourth of needed operating expenses for 1367 University be allocated for FY2022 in the event that the facility opens in Spring 2022. If the facility does not open until FY23, we recommend rolling this allocation over to FY23.

**Action**: M/S/C Marasovic/Wehrman the Homeless Services Panel of Experts strongly recognizes the importance of racial equity training and would like other City funding sources to provide such training to not only City staff but nonprofit organizations that contract with the City of Berkeley, including those servicing persons experiencing homelessness.

**Action:** M/S/C Marasovic/Wehrman recommends funding \$30,000 to conduct deep comprehensive evaluation of homeless services in the City of Berkeley to supplement current evaluation practices.

Motion Fails – no quorum.

**Action:** M/S/C Marasovic/Wehrman \$920,000 for Downtown Streets Team was approved on 4/27/21 Council Consent calendar without referring to the HSPE. HSPE recommends that Council support this program and encourage Council to look for alternative funding sources so that Measure P funding can be directed towards housing.
