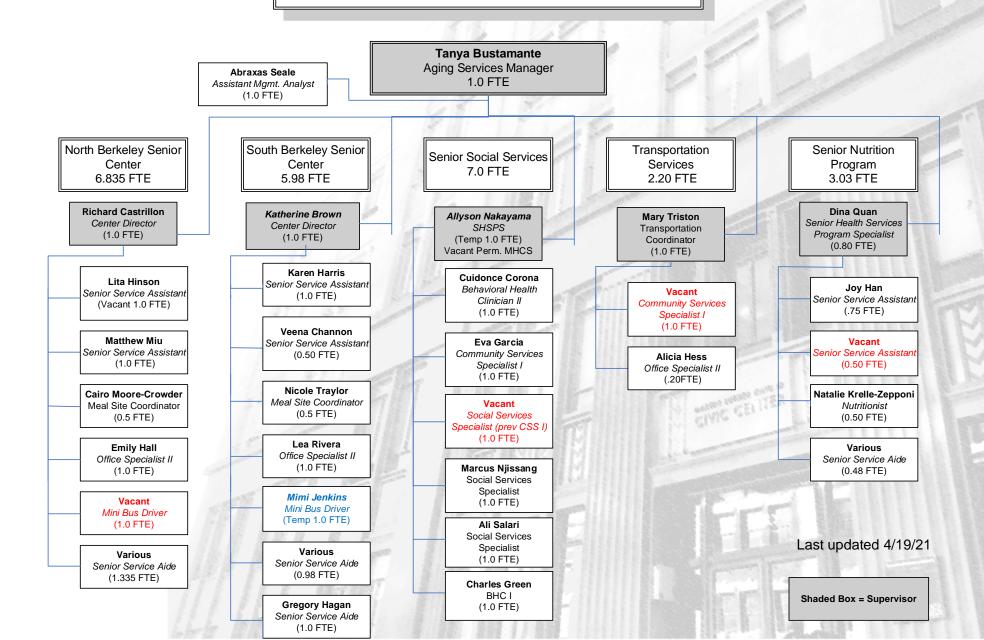

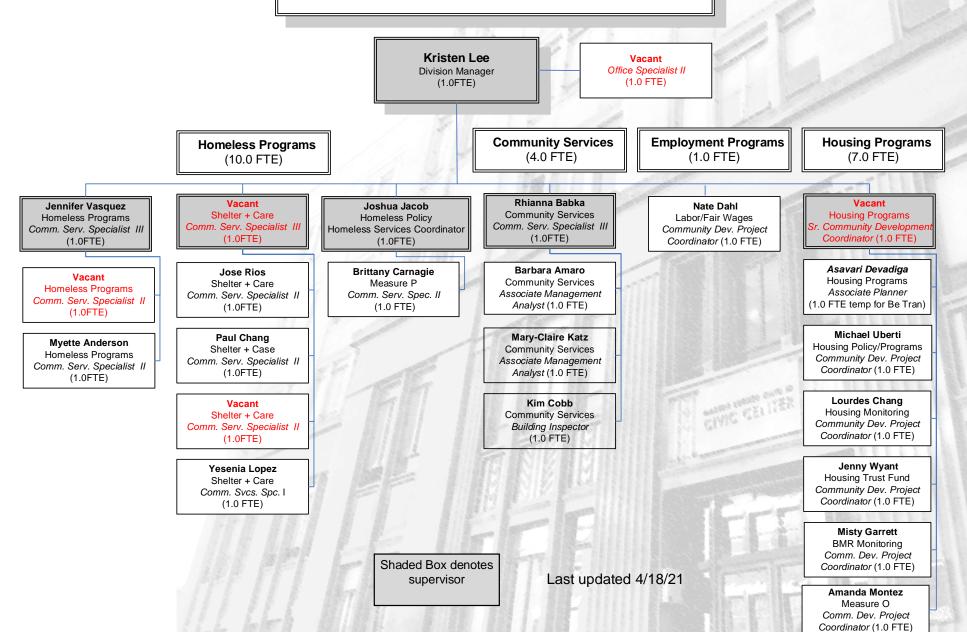
#### Health, Housing & Community Services Department HHCS Office of the Director FY22 35.50 FTE



#### Health, Housing & Community Services Department Aging Services Division Fiscal Year 2022 – 27.045 FTE

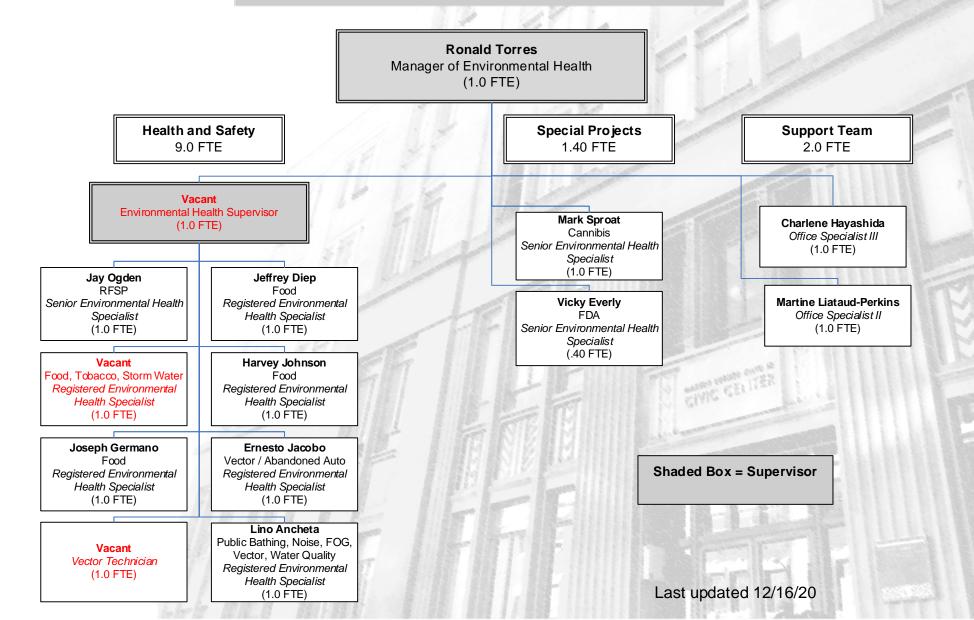


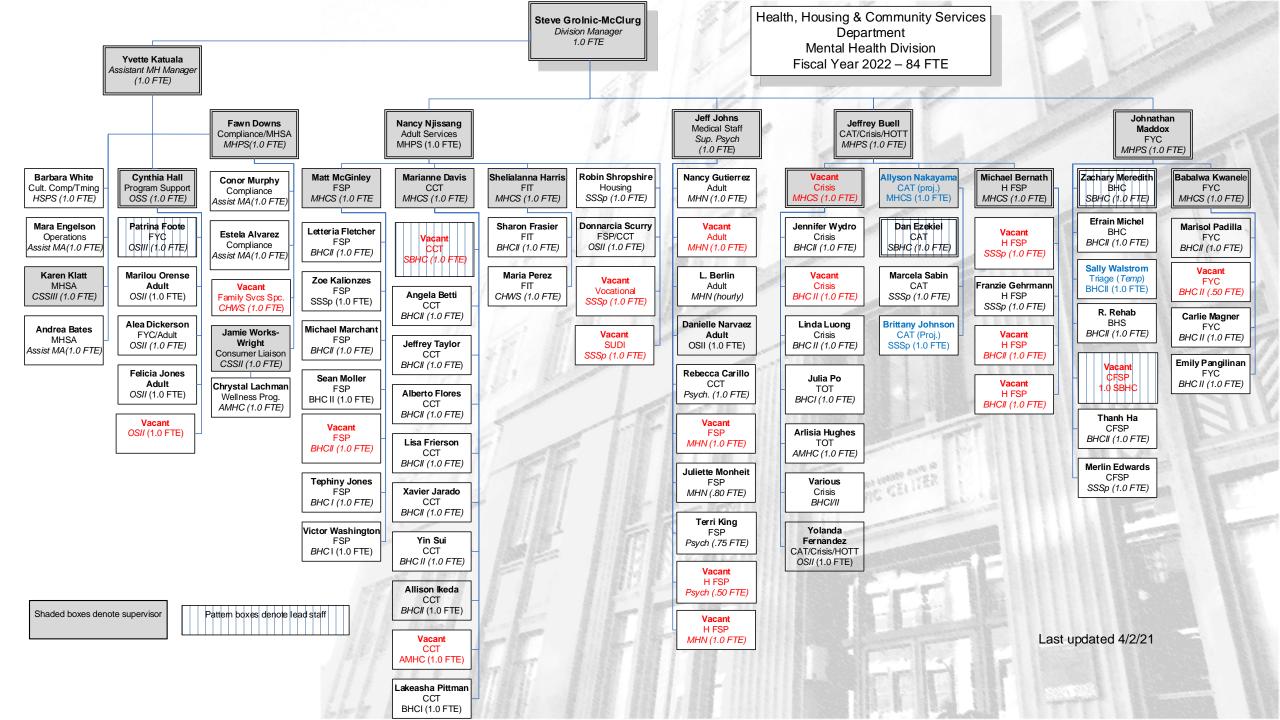
#### Health, Housing & Community Services Department Housing & Community Services Division Fiscal Year 2021 – 24 FTE

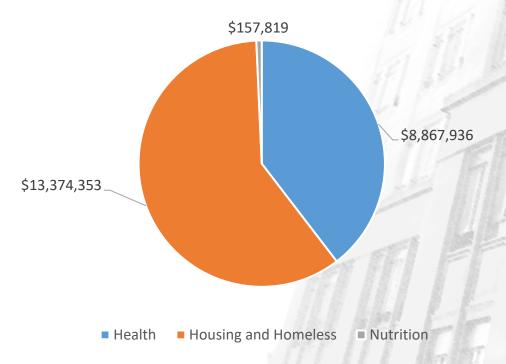

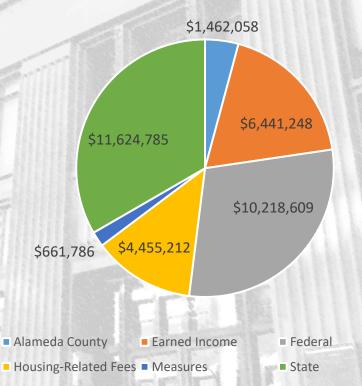

- Replacement software system for Decade in Environmental Health—still evaluating options (unfunded)
- Purchase PowerBI \$83,825/year (funded with COVID grants)



### NEW MANDATES

- HHCS staff assigned to EOC COVID-19 pandemic 1+ year
- \$22M+ in COVID-19 pandemic relief grant funded activities
- Healthy Checkout (Public Health and Environmental Health)
- New housing and homeless programs and projects: Outdoor Shelter, housing at BART sites, Step Up Housing, potential Project Homekey

## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Expanded Impact Berkeley
- Transitioned 240 people from homelessness to permanent housing in FY2020
- Conducted over 400 property inspections with vector-related concerns
- Invested \$1.9 million from the sugar sweetened beverage tax into 11 community and school-based programs to reduce consumption and health impacts of sugary drinks.
