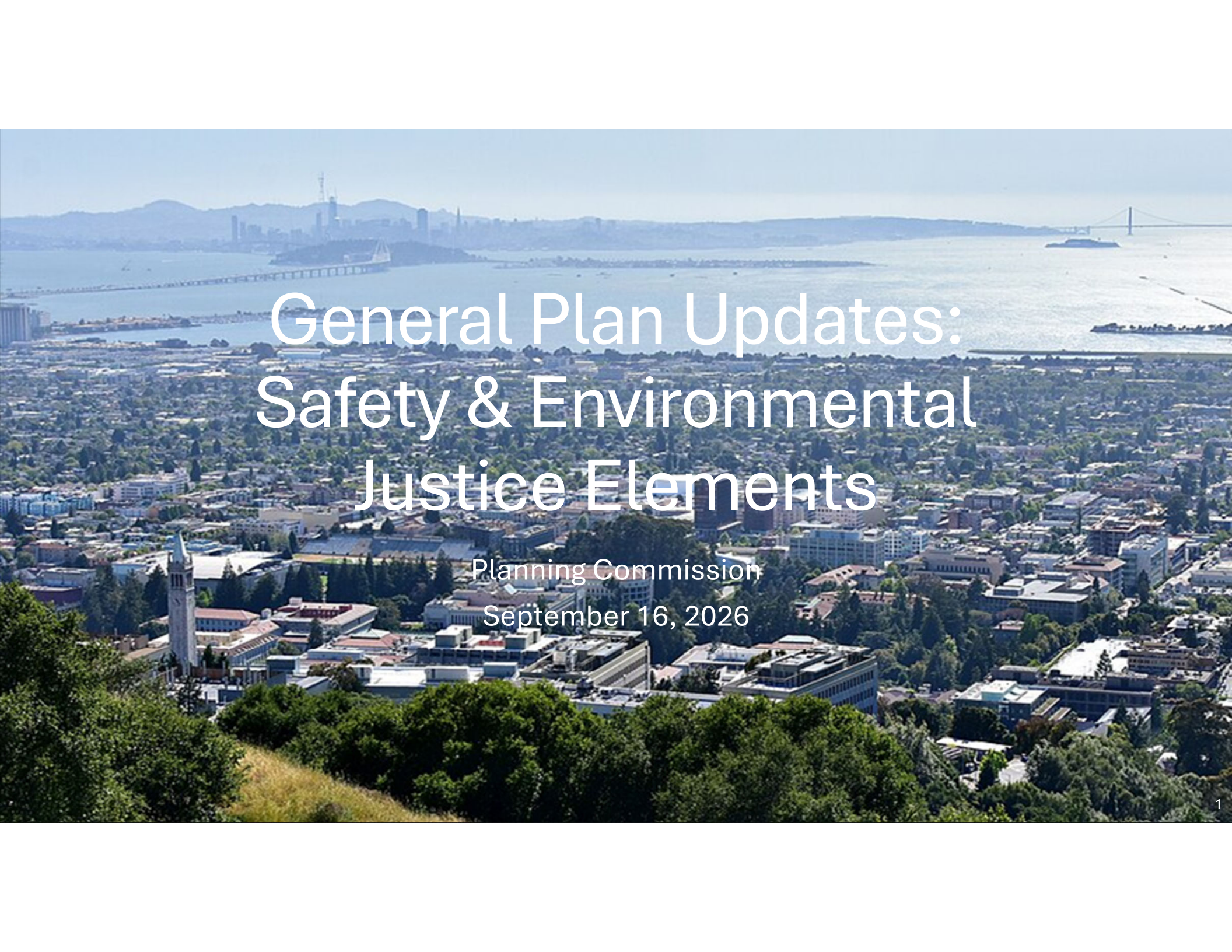

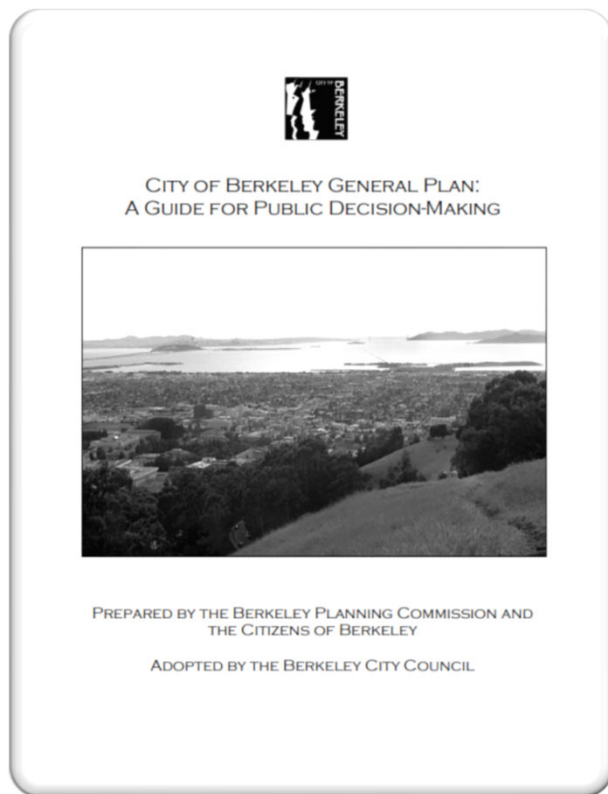
What is a General Plan?

Adopted in 2002

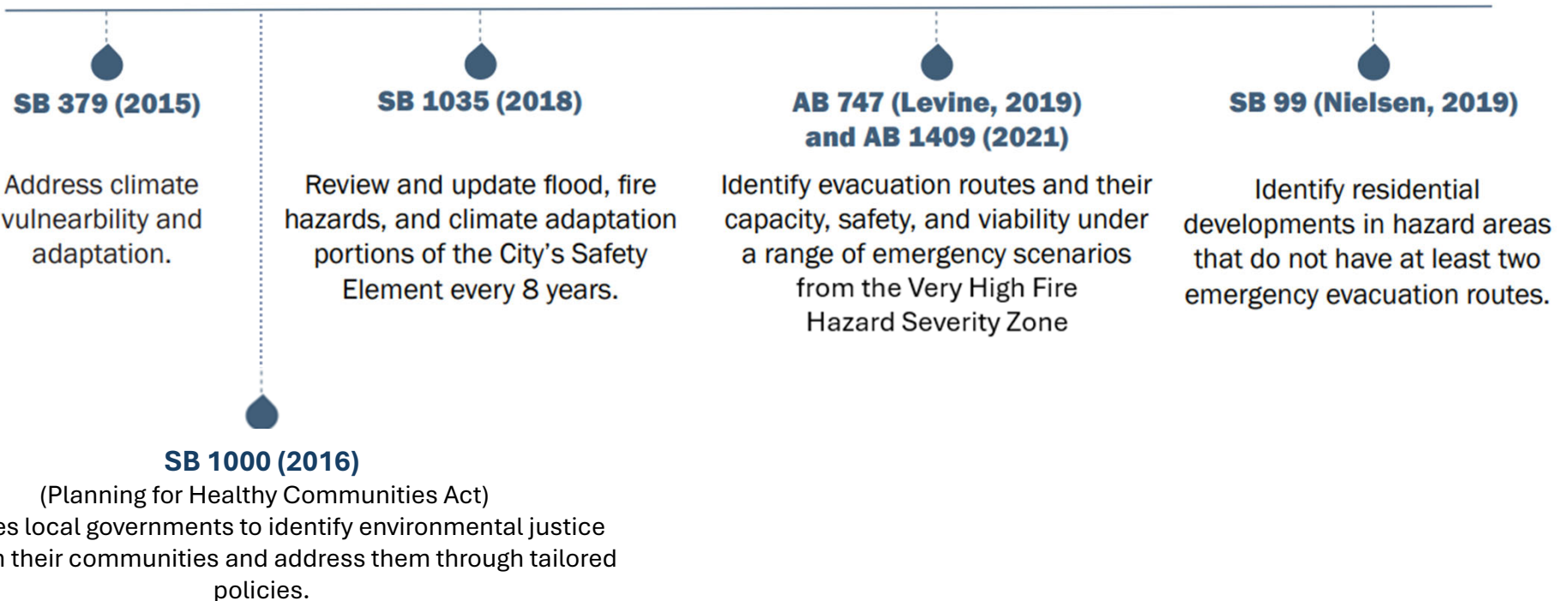


7 Mandatory Elements PLUS:

- Citizen Participation Element



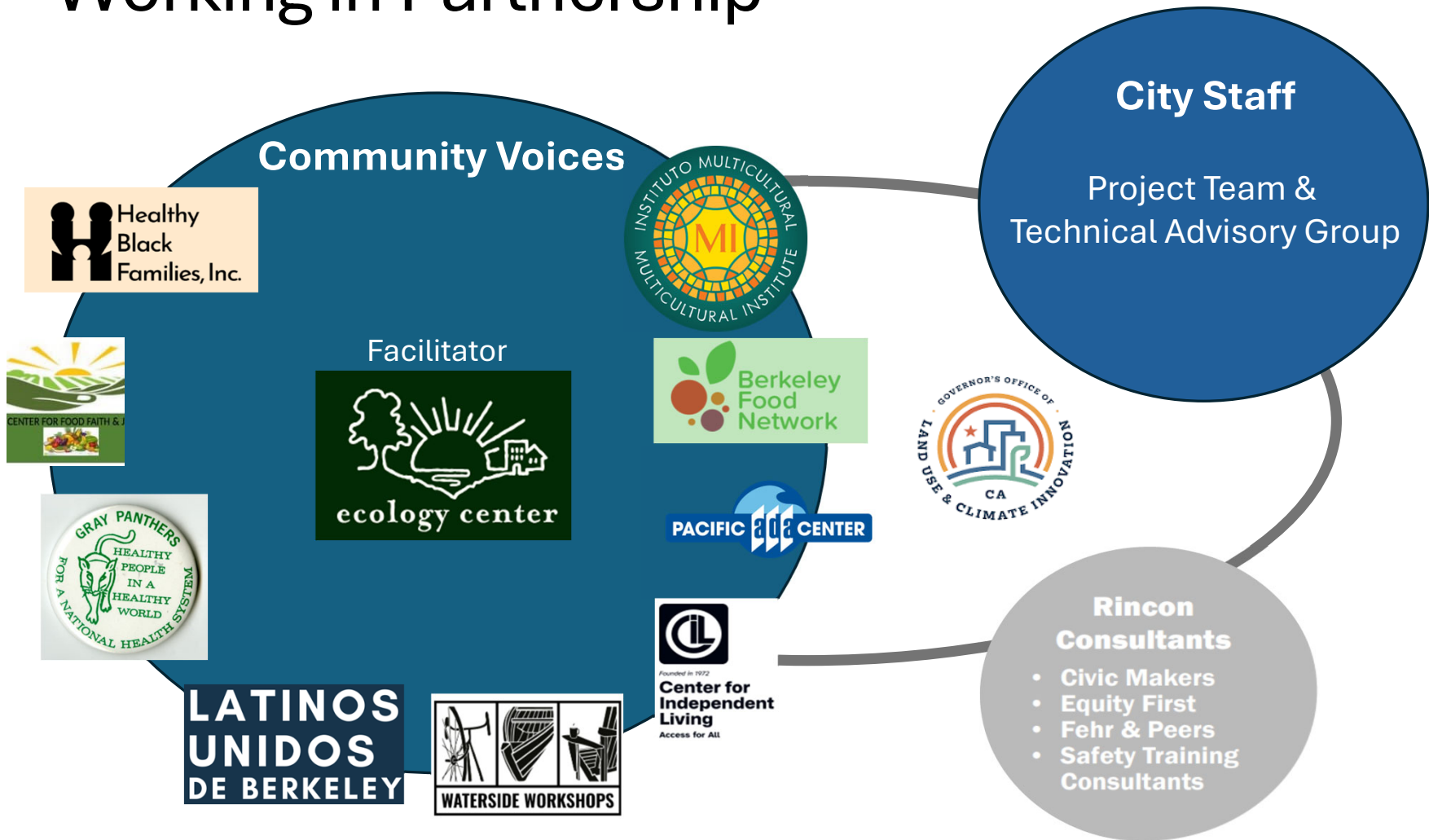

What We Heard from Community - Safety

Priorities Include:

- Equitable disaster preparedness and access to resources
- Community education, training, and hazard awareness
- Strong neighborhood and community partnerships
- Reliable emergency community and response
- Effective evacuation
- Resilient infrastructure and equitable recovery



From Community Priorities to Safety Element

Community Said	The Element Responds With
Reduce risks from natural disasters with a focus on vulnerable communities	Goal S-3 Berkeley reduces vulnerability to wildfires by strengthening the built environment, guiding development away from high-risk area, reducing fuel loads, and fostering partnerships that advance community and regional fire resilience. • <i>Ex: Reduce fire fuel loads (Policy S-3.2)</i>
Strengthen emergency services and equitable disaster response and recovery	Goal S-9 Berkeley provides responsive and effective day-to-day police and fire services by maintaining well-trained first responders, modern equipment, and operational practices that reflect best practices and community needs. • <i>Ex: Enhance first responder training. (Policy S-9.5)</i>
Improve evacuation readiness	Goal S-15 The City Organization is equipped, and the Berkeley community is prepared for effective evacuation and leaving early. • <i>Ex: Build evacuation partnerships for planning and capacity building. (Policy S-15.3)</i>

What We Heard from Community – Environmental Justice (EJ)

Priorities Include:

- Healthier neighborhoods
- Affordable and healthy housing
- Preserve and enhance community, culture, and belonging
- Equitable access to food, parks, and public spaces
- Center community voices in City decisions



“Environmental justice is about more than environmental conditions, it is also about affordability, accessibility, belonging, and who gets to shape the future of their community.”

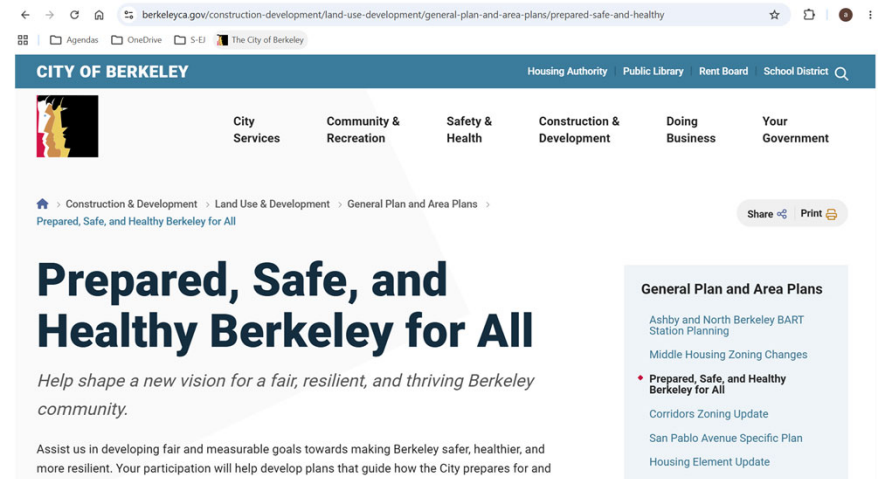

Community Said	The Element Responds With
Make engagement more accessible	Goal EJ-2 Belonging, Equity & Civic Empowerment
Address pollution in overburdened neighborhoods	Goal EJ-3 Pollution Exposure & Air Quality
Improve access to healthy food	Goal EJ-6 Healthy and Affordable Food
Make parks, services & facilities accessible	Goal EJ-7 Services & Facilities / EJ-8 Parks & Green Spaces
Protect housing affordability, health & belonging	Goal EJ-9 Housing Equity & Resilience
<i>“Make engagement accessible and meaningful.”</i> Residents called for earlier engagement, language access, ADA accessibility, participant supports, and stronger partnerships with community organizations.
