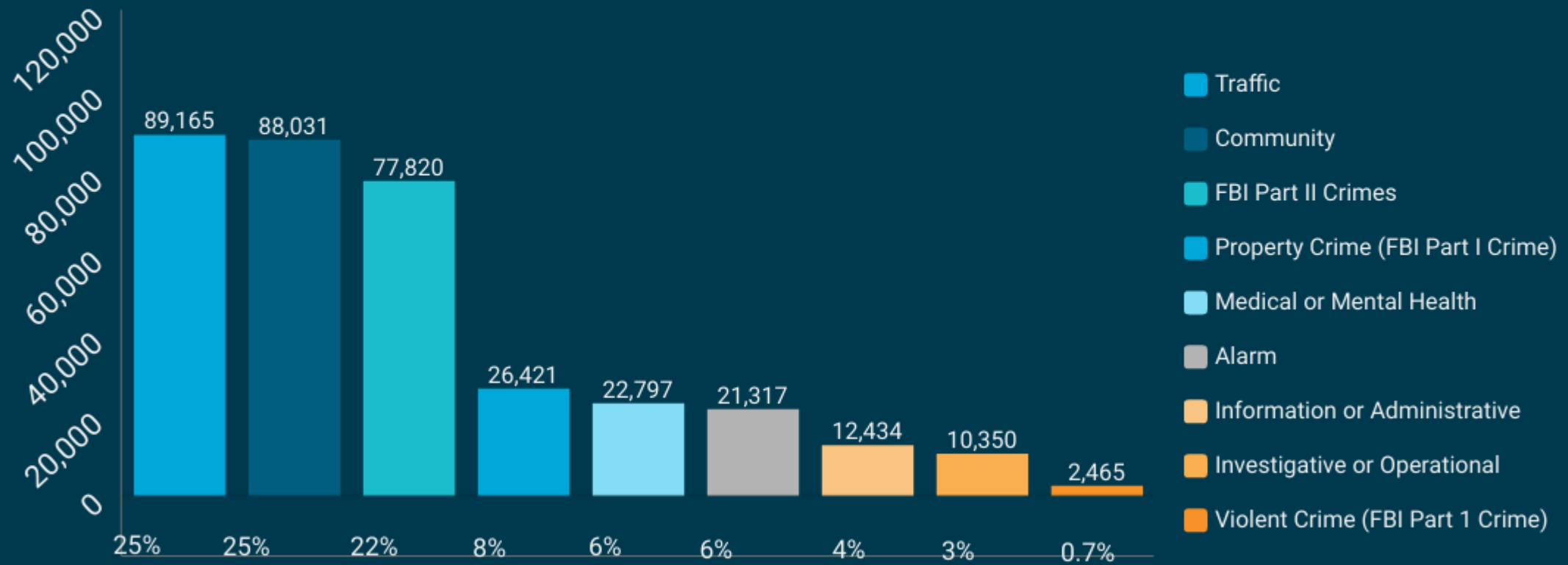

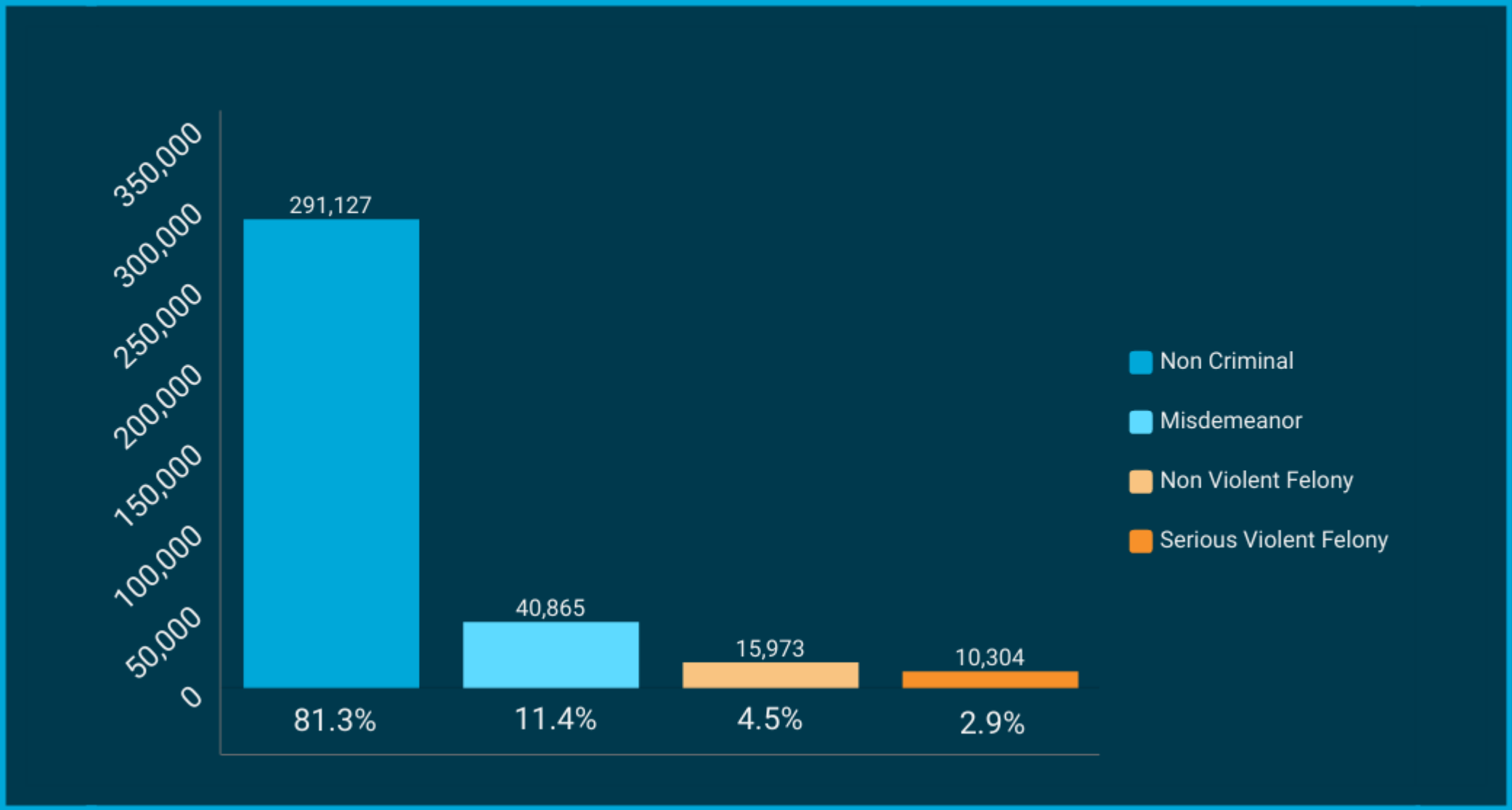

NICJR classified 2.9% of CFS as Serious Violent Felony



Auditor classified .7% as Violent Felony

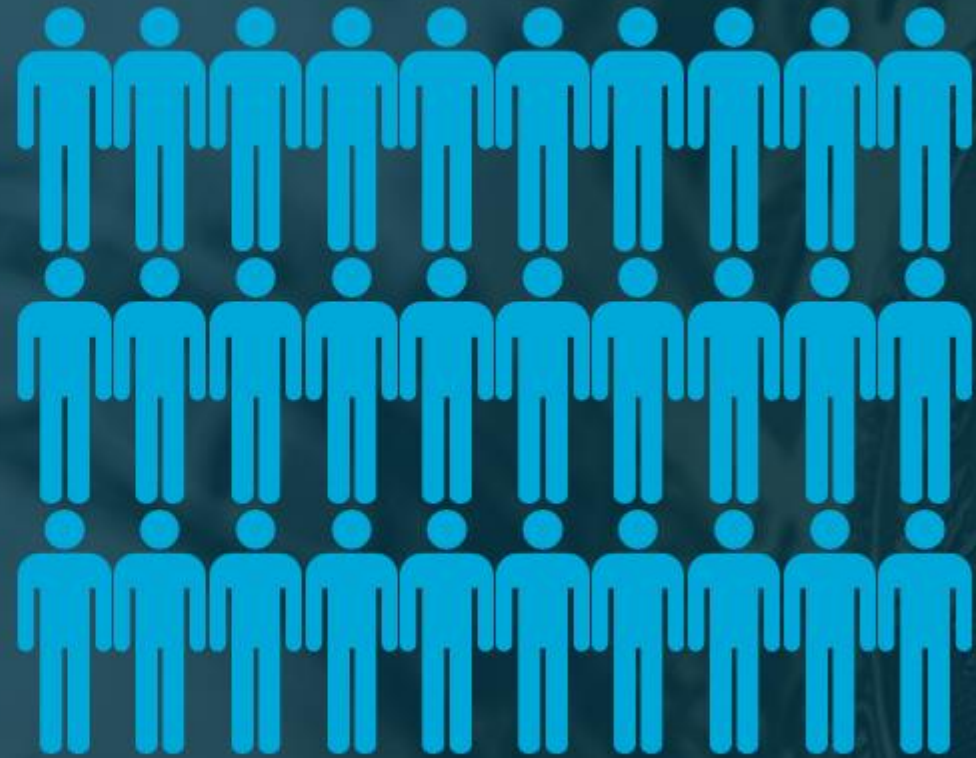

Planned City Resources

- Specialized Care Unit (SCU) planning is currently ongoing
 - Present report assumes mental health and substance use Calls For Service (CFS)

SCU

BerkDOT

- State law changes needed to fully implement allocation of all traffic CFS to Tier 1

CITY-CONTRACTED CBOS:

- Few appear to provide case management services
- Even fewer, case management + criminal justice population experience
- BOSS has both

CONCLUSION AND NEXT STEPS:

- **Savings of around \$6.8 million are annually generated by transitioning Tier 1 to CERN**
- **Ability to build out CERN dependent on clarity around specific roles of SCU and BerkDOT**
- **Community survey and focus group results will be further analyzed and report will be modified accordingly**
 - **Results may inform CERN build out/areas of focus**
