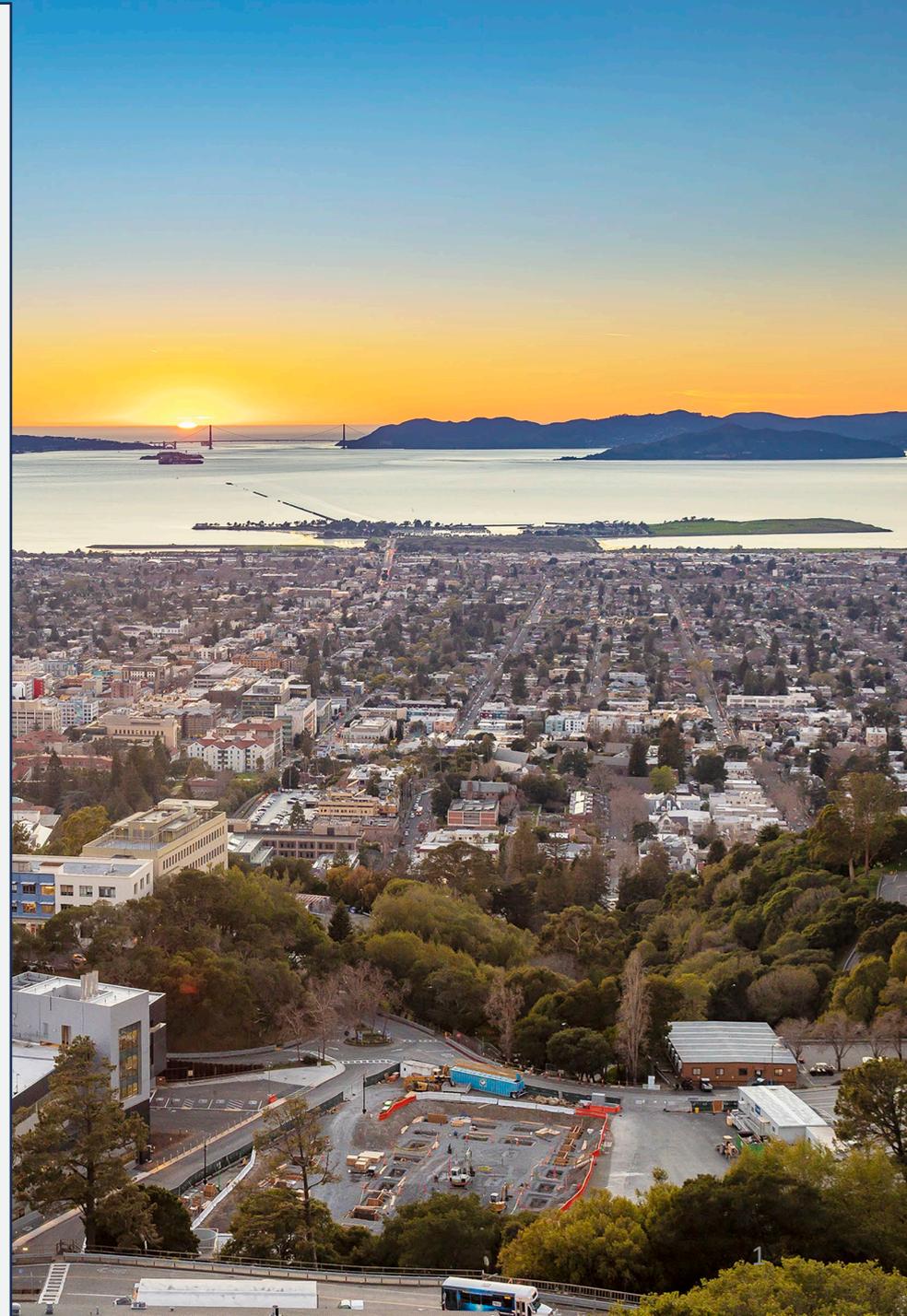






Background

- California Assembly Bill 413 (AB 413) signed into law on October 10, 2023
- Prohibits parking and loading within 20-feet of a marked or unmarked crosswalk
 - Distance reduced to 15 feet if a curb is extended




Daylighting Enhances Pedestrian Safety

Why daylighting?

- Improves visibility for drivers, cyclists and pedestrians
- In Berkeley, over 80% of severe and fatal pedestrian crashes occur in or near crosswalks (data from 2022)
- In Hoboken, New Jersey, from 2009 to 2011, daylighting resulted in a 30% decrease in pedestrian injuries caused by vehicles
- Daylighting is a Key Vision Zero strategy






Council Referral

- January 2025: Public Works received a budget referral titled, “Curb Marking and Preventative Infrastructure Upgrades at High-Risk Intersections in Accordance with the New California Daylighting Law, AB 413.”
- This referral allocated \$1,250,000 to the PW budget

As of 10/24/2025,
1,426 of 1,690
intersections are
complete (84%)







Daylighting: Preventative Infrastructure Micromobility Hubs and Vision Zero

Preventative Infrastructure: Vision Zero

- PW Staff and a consultant are developing a Vision Zero Quick Build Toolkit as part of Vision Zero Action Plan Update
- Toolkit will include materials menu, general design principles, and standard detail drawings of quick build treatments
- Toolkit guidance will be integrated into routine City workflows (e.g., work orders, Capital Improvement Projects, and permit review)
