





Electric Mobility Roadmap

- Ensures equitable access to the benefits of clean transportation




Electric Mobility Roadmap

- Demonstrate City Leadership




Achieve Zero Net Carbon



Strategies include:

- EV Charging in New and Existing Buildings
- Public EV Charging on City Property
- Private EV Charging
 Site Hosts
- Electric Mobility Education and Outreach



Curbside Residential Charging Pilot

- For residents without offstreet parking
 - New on-site space or curbside
- Launched Dec 2014
 - Extended through Dec 2020
- Property owner financed (& controlled use)
- EV charging station, not outlet alone
- Street parking remains available to all




Pilot Applications



62 Applications


- On-site charging
 - 9 qualified, 4 installed
- Curbside charging
 - 36 qualified, <u>7 installed</u>
- Not eligible
 - 16 didn't qualify and 1 withdrawn

 Only 6 applications and 2 installations in the last 3 years




Pilot Findings and Next Steps

- Strong interest, but few installations
 - Expense
 - Access concerns
- Researching/vetting potential alternatives or additions to increase access and equity
 - Cord cover programs
 - DCFC hubs
 - EBCE
 - Commercial curbside programs



EV Charging in New and Existing Buildings

- New construction requirements for EV charging (CALGreen amendment)
- 146 publicly-available EV charging ports in Berkeley (Oct 2020)
 - 73 provided by City of Berkeley
- Monitor and share utility/grant opportunities






