





PERFORMANCE MEASURES


Call response time (CRT)



Factors contributing to Current the CRT Performance:

- -Berkeley has 7 fire stations located throughout the City to minimize response time as determined in the early 1980's
- -The additional challenge of staff responding to Covid-19 emergency medical calls

• Fire Prevention inspections




Factors contributing to Current the Fire Prevention Inspection Performance:

NEW MANDATES

- Measure FF
 - Expand new and existing wildfire safety and vegetation management programs
 - Public notification system
 - Prioritized dispatch
 - Emergency medical services expansion
 - Fire suppression reorganization

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

 Pandemic: Responded with new policies, procedures, equipment, and response models to the global pandemic, including; the City's Emergency Operations Center, Cost Recovery efforts, COVID-19 testing, and the COVID-19 mass vaccination site.

• **Fire Prevention**: Maintained essential fire prevention services throughout the duration of the pandemic given limited resources.

 Multiple Activations: Activated the City's Emergency Operations Center in response to multiple emergencies, PSPS, and election.

• Wildfires: Responded to multiple wildland fires throughout California.

Maintaining Staffing: Completed recruitment processes for May 2021 academy.



CHALLENGES

- Expand wildland safety and vegetation management programs.
- Continued response to COVID-19.
- Implement extensive Measure FF programs.
- Make up for the backlog of Fire Prevention Inspections due to COVID-19.
- Impact of responding to emergencies with limited staff due to budget deferrals lead to a substantial increase in overtime.
