

LIST OF TYPOGRAPHICAL ERRORS AND SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES NEEDED AS IDENTIFIED BY BOARD MEMBER CALAVITA

1. P. 2: delete "(m) Eyewitness" as that is no longer in this version and might confuse things.
2. P. 6, under C)(1)(b): the Section to be cited is Section II.**M**. (not II.N.)
3. P. 7, line 3: Add "in consultation with the complainant". This was discussed and added at our last meeting.
4. P. 8, top line: (iii) "Names, addresses, telephone numbers..." (i.e. no caps on "addresses" and "telephone")
5. P. 10,E(1), line 4: Change the "**below conditions** of item 5.a...." to "the conditions of Item **5.a. below** are met"
6. P. 17, I.1) "Who may or must be present at hearing. **The** hearing is closed..." (i.e. add "The")
7. P. 17,I.(4)(a). "A **complainant** or subject officer..." (i.e. change "complaint" to "complainant")
8. P. 17. last line, first word: "the" should be "they"
9. P. 19, line 4. Delete "Relevant body-worn camera footage in advance of the hearing." as this is redundant with previous sentence.
10. P. 19, Section 8: "following elements" (i.e. add an "s" on element.)
11. P. 21.(e). Delete reference to Charter Amendment to be consistent with style throughout.
12. P. 26. Section C: "If the Board decides..." (not "decided")
13. P. 26. Section C: Delete from "At said hearing a complainant..." through to the end of section.

This is very important since complainants are required by the Charter to testify. I had sent an email to this effect after the last meeting. Section C should now read:

"C. If the Board decides to process the complaint, ODPa staff shall initiate a complaint investigation, including interviews, body-worn camera footage, etc., as provided in Section II(C) above. If necessary (following Section II (E)(5)(a)), a complaint hearing shall be scheduled. At said hearing, a complainant who requests anonymity shall attend the hearing remotely via electronic audio but no video, in order to preserve their anonymity. A complainant who requests confidentiality shall attend the hearing either remotely via electronic audio-video or in person in such a way as to preserve their confidentiality. To the extent possible, the identity of an individual who submits an anonymous or confidential informal complaint shall remain anonymous/confidential, if requested."
